- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-35-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the membership of the legislative management; and to provide for application declare
- 3 an emergency.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 54-35-01. Legislative management - Created - Members - Vacancy - Terms. 8 The North Dakota legislative management consists of the majority and minority 9 leaders of the house and of the senate plus six senators and seven representatives 10 chosenappointed biennially before the close of each regular legislative session. 11 2. In addition to the majority and minority leaders, in the house of representatives the 12 speaker of the house shall appoint to the legislative management the four members-13 recommended byof the majority leaderfaction who have the most seniority in the 14 house of representatives and who have not served two terms as a member of the 15 legislative management and the three members recommended byof the minority-16 leader, except that the speaker must by virtue of office be one of the four members-17 appointed from the speaker's faction who have the most seniority in the house of 18 representatives and who have not served two terms as a member of the legislative 19 management. 20 3. In addition to the majority and minority leaders, in the senate the lieutenant-21 governorpresident pro tempore shall appoint to the legislative management the four-22 members recommended byof the majority leaderfaction who have the most seniority in-23 the senate and who have not served two terms as a member of the legislative-24 management and the two members recommended byof the minority leaderfaction who-

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1		have the most seniority in the senate and who have not served two terms as a		
2		member of the legislative management.		
3	<u> <u>4.    </u></u>	If each member of a faction in the house of representatives or the senate has served		
4		two full terms as a member of the legislative management, the member of that faction		
5		who has the most seniority in that house is eligible for appointment to one additional		
6		term as a member of the legislative management notwithstanding the provisions of		
7		subsections 2 and 3.		
8	<u> <u>5.</u> </u>	Any vacancy on the legislative management occurring when the legislative assembly		
9		is not in session must be filled by the selection appointment of another the member of		
10		the legislative assembly belonging to the same faction in the same house of the		
11		legislative assembly as the member originally appointed, the selection appointment to		
12		be made by the remaining senate or house members of the legislative management,		
13		depending upon which body has the vacancy.		
14	<u> <u>6.</u> </u>	Each senator and each representative chosen to serve on the legislative management		
15		shall serve until a new legislative management has been selected at the next regular		
16		legislative session; provided, however, that no senator, not a holdover, who is not		
17		reelected to the senate, and no representative, who is not reelected to the house of		
18		representatives, may serve as a member of the legislative management beyond the		
19		closing day of the term to which elected. Any vacancy occurring because any member		
20		of the legislative management is not reelected must be filled for the period from the		
21		beginning of the session until a new legislative management is selected appointed, in		
22		the same manner as the original legislative management is selected appointed.		
23	<u> </u>	The time a member of the legislative assembly serves on the legislative management		
24		after appointed to fill a vacancy under subsection 5 or 6 does not count as a term for		
25		the purposes of determining eligibility for appointment under subsections 2 and 3.		
26	<u> <u>8.     </u></u>	a. The members of the legislative management shall select a chairman of the		
27		legislative management by a majority vote at the first meeting after the close of		
28		each legislative session. However, if the same political faction comprises the		
29		majority in both houses of the legislative assembly, the chairman position must be		
30		selected from among a member of the chamber of the legislative assembly		
31		opposite of which the previous chairman was a member.		

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1	<u>b. A member of the legislative management may serve only one term as chairman</u>			
2	of the legislative management.			
3				
4	council before the effective date of this Act must be counted as service for the purposes of			
5	determining eligibility for appointment to the legislative management under subsections 3 and 4-			
6	of section 54-35-01, as amended by section 1 of this Act. Upon the effective date of this Act,			
7	any member of the legislative management who does not meet the eligibility requirements			
8	under subsections 3 and 4 of section 54-35-01, as amended by section 1 of this Act, is deemed			
9	to have vacated the position. Notwithstanding the appointment process to fill a vacancy-			
10	provided under subsection 5 of section 54-35-01, as amended by section 1 of this Act, the			
11	speaker of the house or the president pro tempore shall appoint the next eligible member of the			
12	appropriate house to fill the vacancy.			
13	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
14	amended and reenacted as follows:			
15	54-35-01. Legislative management - Created - Members - Vacancy - Terms.			
16	1. The North Dakota legislative management consists of the majority and minority			
17	leaders of the house and of the senate plus six senators and seven representatives			
18	chosen biennially before the close of each regular legislative session.			
19	2. In the house of representatives the speaker of the house majority leader shall appoint			
20	to the legislative management <del>four</del> members <del>recommended<u>elected</u> by the majority</del>			
21	leader and three members recommended by political party with the largest number of			
22	members in the house and the minority leader of the house shall appoint to the			
23	legislative management members elected by the political party with the next largest			
24	number of members in the house, except that the speaker must by virtue of office be			
25	one of the four members appointed from the speaker's faction political party.			
26	3. In the senate the lieutenant governor majority leader shall appoint to the legislative			
27	management four members recommendedelected by the majority leader and two-			
28	members recommended by political party with the largest number of members in the			
29	senate and the minority leader shall appoint to the legislative management two			
30	members elected by the political party with the next largest number of members in the			
31	senate.			

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1	4.	The majority and minority leaders of the house of representatives shall make the
2		appointments so as to give the two political parties having the most members in the
3		house the same total proportionate representation on the legislative management as
4		prevails in the house. In allocating the membership on the legislative management to
5		each political party, the total number of members in the house of representatives must
6		be divided by nine; the resulting quotient must then be divided into the number of
7		members of each of the two political parties of the house; the resulting quotient for
8		each party of the house, rounded to the nearest whole number, is the number of
9		members of that political party in the house to be on the legislative management.
10		Notwithstanding this allocation, if the number of members in the minority political party
11		in the house of representatives would not result in any representation on the legislative
12		management, the minority leader in the house must represent that party on the
13		legislative management.
14	5.	A member of the house of representatives may not be appointed to serve as a
15		member of the legislative management more than twice.
16	6.	_Any vacancy occurring when the legislative assembly is not in session must be filled
17		by the selection of another member of the legislative assembly belonging to the same
18		factionparty as the member originally appointed, the selection to be made by the
19		remaining senate or house members of the legislative management, depending upon
20		which body has the vacancy. Each senator and each representative chosen to serve
21		on the legislative management shall serve until a new legislative management has
22		been selected at the next regular legislative session; provided, however, that no
23		senator, not a holdover, who is not reelected to the senate, and no representative, who
24		is not reelected to the house of representatives, may serve as a member of the
25		legislative management beyond the closing day of the term to which elected. Any
26		vacancy occurring because any member of the legislative management is not
27		reelected must be filled for the period from the beginning of the session until a new
28		legislative management is selected, in the same manner as the original legislative
29		management is selected.
