One individual who is a nonpublic school classroom teacher; 14 c. Two individuals who are school board members: 15 d. Two individuals who are administrators; and 16 e. One dean of a college of education or chairman of a department of education. 17 The education standards and practices board consists of: 18 The following gubernatorial appointed members: 19 One individual employed as an early childhood teacher; 20 <u>b.</u> One individual employed as an elementary teacher; 21 c. One individual employed as a middle school teacher; 22 d. One individual employed as a high school teacher; 23 e. One school board member; 24 <u>f.</u> One school administrator holding a doctoral degree;
