- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-13-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 9 1. Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 28-32.
- 10 2. Contract with other states for the reciprocal approval of teacher preparation programs.
- 11 3. Apply for and receive federal or other funds on behalf of the state for purposes related to its duties.
- 13 4.3. Perform any duty related to the improvement of instruction through teacher education, 14 professional development, and continuing education programs.
- 15 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-13-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 15.1-13-20. Interim reciprocal teaching license Period of validity Applicants licensed
 in other states.
 - The board shall grant an interim reciprocala teaching license in accordance with sections 15.1-18-02 and 15.1-18-03 to an individual to an applicant who holds a regular teaching license or certificate from another state, provided:
 - a. The individual'sapplicant's licensure or certification is based upon a minimum of a bachelor's degree with a major that meets the issuing state's requirements in

3	b. The individual's applicant's licensure or certification is based upon the completion		
4		of a professional educ	ation sequence from a state-approved teacher education

8		d. The criminal history re	cord check reveals nothing for which a North Dakota
9		applicant would be de	nied initial licensure ; and .

11		a licensed teacher in t	his state.
12	2.	An interim reciprocal licens	e granted under this section is valid for two years.
13	3.	The individual shall submit evidence of progress on the plan required by subsection 1	
14		to the board prior to renewal of the interim reciprocal license.	
15	4 .	The board may renew the interim reciprocal license for one additional two-year period	
16		f the board finds that the in	dividual has demonstrated satisfactory progress.
17	5.	Notwithstanding any other law, an interim reciprocal license granted under this section	
18		is the equivalent of a teaching license granted under this chapter.

2	courses as the board may prescribe.	
3	(2) If the individual received a teaching license or certificate from another state	
4	before January 1, 2002, the board shall require that the individual, within	
5	two years from the date of licensure, earn any college credits in native	
6	American or multicultural courses as the board may prescribe.	
7	c. In all other cases, a license granted under this section is valid for five years and	
8	is renewable if the licenseholder meets the reeducation requirements established	
9	for all five-year license renewals.
