- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-13-09 and 15.1-13-20 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the licensing of teachers from other states; and to repeal
- 3 section 15.1-13-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reciprocal teaching licenses.

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

## 7 **15.1-13-09.** Board powers.

- 8 The board may:
- 9 1. Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 28-32.
- 10 2. Contract with other states for the reciprocal approval of teacher preparation programs.
- Apply for and receive federal or other funds on behalf of the state for purposes related
  to its duties.
- 4.3. Perform any duty related to the improvement of instruction through teacher education,
   professional development, and continuing education programs.
- 15 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-13-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 19 1. The board shall grant an interim reciprocala teaching license in accordance with
- sections 15.1-18-02 and 15.1-18-03 to an individual<u>to an applicant</u> who holds a regular
   teaching license or certificate from another state, provided:
- a. The individual'sapplicant's licensure or certification is based upon a minimum of a
   bachelor's degree with a major that meets the issuing state's requirements in
