- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to registration of music therapists; and to provide for a penalty.

### 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 5 enacted as follows:

#### 6 **Definitions**.

- 7 <u>1.</u> "Certificate of registration" means a document issued by the registrar to an individual
  8 who meets the music therapist requirements under this chapter.
- 9 <u>2.</u> "Music therapist" is an individual who practices music therapy.
- 10 <u>3.</u> <u>"Music therapy" is the specialized use of music and the materials of music to restore,</u>
- 11 <u>maintain, and improve the following areas of functioning: cognitive, psychological,</u>
- 12 <u>social or emotional, affective, physical, sensory or sensorimotor; motor,</u>
- 13 <u>communicative; and physiological functioning. Techniques used in the practice of</u>
- 14 <u>music therapy include the use of music to provide participatory individual and group</u>
- 15 <u>experiences; musical improvisation; therapeutic development of verbal skills and</u>
- 16 <u>nonverbal behavior; receptive music learning; lyric discussions; memory recall; music</u>
- 17 <u>and imagery; self-expression through composition and songwriting; socialization and</u>
- 18 <u>enhancement of self-esteem through music performance; relaxation to music,</u>
- 19 including stress and pain management; learning through music; cultural and spiritual
- 20 <u>expression; development of fine and gross motor skills through responses to rhythm;</u>
- 21 respiratory and speech improvements through sound production; sensory integration
- 22 and stimulation; increased awareness of music for development of recreation and
- 23 leisure interests; and interactive verbal techniques to help facilitate, elicit, or

- 3 <u>4.</u> <u>"Registrant" means an individual who holds a valid certificate of registration.</u>
- 4 <u>5.</u> <u>"Registrar" means the state department of health.</u>
- 5 **Registration agency.**
- 6 <u>The state department of health shall receive music therapy registration applications and</u>
- 7 shall issue certificates of registration to qualified applicants.
- 8 <u>Music therapy registration Exceptions.</u>
- 9 Effective August 1, 2012, a person may not hold oneself out as practicing music therapy,
- 10 hold oneself out as being a music therapist, or use a title or other designation indicating the
- 11 person is a music therapist in this state unless that person holds a valid certificate of registration
- 12 issued by the registrar under this chapter. The registration provisions of this chapter do not
- 13 apply to licensed practitioners of professions who practice music therapy within the scope of
- 14 practice of the profession for which they are licensed. This chapter does not exempt an
- 15 individual who practices music therapy from regulatory provisions of any other profession for
- 16 which that individual is licensed.

# 17 Application for registration - Fees - Renewal.

- <u>To obtain a certificate of registration under this chapter, an applicant shall submit to the</u>
   <u>registrar a completed application, on forms the registrar prescribes, and shall pay the</u>
   <u>annual registration fee of one hundred dollars. A gualified applicant must be at least</u>
- 21 <u>eighteen years of age.</u>
- 22 2. Upon receipt of a completed application and the registration fee submitted by a
- qualified applicant, the registrar shall issue a certificate of registration to the applicant.
  A certificate of registration is valid through December thirty-first of the year for which it
- 243.A certificate of registration is valid through December thirty-first of the year for which it25is issued. A registrant shall renew the registration annually by submitting to the
- registrar the required renewal form, as prescribed by the registrar, and a renewal fee
   of one hundred dollars.
- 28 Registrant duties Rules Deposit of fees.
- 29 <u>1.</u> <u>The registrar shall designate on the certificate of registration that the registrant is</u>
- 30 <u>certified, registered, or accredited as a music therapist by a registrar-recognized</u>
- 31 <u>national organization that certifies, registers, or accredits music therapists.</u>

- 1 <u>2.</u> <u>Any moneys the registrar collects as registration fees or renewal fees under this</u>
- 2 <u>chapter must be deposited in the state department of health operating fund in the state</u>
- 3 treasury and must be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.

## 4 <u>Penalty.</u>

- 5 Any person that fails to obtain a certificate of registration as required under this chapter is
- 6 guilty of an infraction.
