- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to registration of music therapists; and to provide for a penalty; and to provide an
- 3 appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and
6 enacted as follows:

7 <u>Definitions.</u>

- 8 <u>1.</u> "Certificate of registration" means a document issued by the registrar to an individual
 9 who meets the music therapist requirements under this chapter.
- 10 <u>2.</u> <u>"Music therapist" is an individual who practices music therapy.</u>
- 11 <u>3.</u> <u>"Music therapy" is the specialized use of music and the materials of music to restore,</u>
- 12 <u>maintain, and improve the following areas of functioning: cognitive, psychological,</u>
- 13 <u>social or emotional, affective, physical, sensory or sensorimotor; motor,</u>
- 14 <u>communicative; and physiological functioning. Techniques used in the practice of</u>
- 15 <u>music therapy include the use of music to provide participatory individual and group</u>
- 16 <u>experiences; musical improvisation; therapeutic development of verbal skills and</u>
- 17 <u>nonverbal behavior; receptive music learning; lyric discussions; memory recall; music</u>
- 18 and imagery; self-expression through composition and songwriting; socialization and
- 19 <u>enhancement of self-esteem through music performance; relaxation to music,</u>
- 20 including stress and pain management; learning through music; cultural and spiritual
- 21 expression; development of fine and gross motor skills through responses to rhythm;
- 22 respiratory and speech improvements through sound production; sensory integration
- 23 and stimulation; increased awareness of music for development of recreation and
- 24 leisure interests; and interactive verbal techniques to help facilitate, elicit, or

3	<u>4.</u>	"Registrant" means an individual who holds a valid certificate of registration.	
4	<u>5.</u>	"Registrar" means the state department of health.	
5	Registration agency.		
6	The	state department of health shall receive music therapy registration applications and	
7	shall iss	ue certificates of registration to qualified applicants.	
8	Music therapy registration - Exceptions.		
9	Effective August 1, 2012, a personan individual may not hold oneself out as practicing		
10	music therapy, hold oneself out as being a music therapist, or use a title or other designation		
11	indicatin	g the personindividual is a music therapist in this state unless that personindividual	
12	holds a	valid certificate of registration issued by the registrar under this chapter. The registration	
13	provisions of this chapter do not apply to licensed practitioners of professions who practice		
14	music therapy within the scope of practice of the profession for which they are licensed. This		
15	chapter does not exempt an individual who practices music therapy from regulatory provisions		
16	of any other profession for which that individual is licensed prevent or restrict the practice.		
17	services, or activities of any individual licensed in another profession or any individual		
18	supervised by a licensed professional from performing work incidental to the practice of that		
19	profession or occupation, if that individual does not represent the individual as a music		
20	therapist.		
21	<u>App</u>	lication for registration - Fees - Renewal.	
22	<u>1.</u>	To obtain a certificate of registration under this chapter, an applicant shall submit to the	
23		registrar a completed application, on forms the registrar prescribes, and shall pay the	
24		annual registration fee of one hundredfifty dollars. A qualified applicant must be at	
25		least eighteen years of age.	
26	<u>2.</u>	Upon receipt of a completed application and the registration fee submitted by a	
27		qualified applicant, the registrar shall issue a certificate of registration to the applicant.	
28	<u>3.</u>	A certificate of registration is valid through December thirty-first of the year for which it	
29		is issued. A registrant shall renew the registration annually by submitting to the	
30		registrar the required renewal form, as prescribed by the registrar, and a renewal fee	
31		of one hundred dollars.

1	Reg	<u>istrant duties - Rules - Deposit of fees.</u>	
2	<u>1.</u>	The registrar shall designate on the certificate of registration that the registrant is	
3		certified, registered, or accredited as a music therapist by a registrar-recognized	
4		national organization that certifies, registers, or accredits music therapists.holds the	
5		music therapist board-certified credential from the certification board for music	
6		therapists or holds a professional designation from the national music therapy registry,	
7		which includes registered music therapist, certified music therapist, and advanced	
8		certified music therapist.	
9	<u>2.</u>	Any moneys the registrar collects as registration fees or renewal fees under this	
10		chapter must be deposited in the state department of health operating fund in the state	
11		treasury and must be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.	
12	Penalty.		
13	Any person that individual who fails to obtain a certificate of registration as required under		
14	this chapter is guilty of an infraction.		
15	SEC	CTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the state	
16	department of health operating fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$4,500, or so much		
17	of the sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of		
18	establishing and maintaining a music therapist registry, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011,		
19	and ending June 30, 2013.
