- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 49-23 of the North Dakota-
- 2 Century Code, relating to gas-gathering pipelines and the one-call excavation notice system.for
- 3 an Act to amend and reenact subsections 11 and 15 of section 49-23-01, subdivision a of
- 4 <u>subsection 3 of section 49-23-03, and section 49-23-04 of the North Dakota Century Code</u>,
- 5 relating to the one-call excavation notice system.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7	- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 49-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
8	and enacted as follows:			
9	Gas-gathering pipelines mapped and filed.			
10	<u>— An operator of gas-gathering pipelines shall provide a map of the location of gas-gathering</u>			
11	pipelines within ninety days of completion of construction to the statewide notification center for			
12	the one-call excavation notice system.			
13	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsections 11 and 15 of section 49-23-01 of the North			
14	Dakota Century Code are amended and reenacted as follows:			
15	11.	"Locate" means an operator's markings of an underground facility showing the		
16		approximate horizontal location, including all lines, line direction, intersections, tees,		
17		and lateral facilities.		
18	15.	"Underground facility" means an underground line, pipeline, cable, facility, system, and		
19		its appurtenances used to produce, store, convey, gather, transmit, or distribute		
20		communications, data, electricity, power, television signals, heat, gas, oil, petroleum		
21		products, carbon dioxide, water, steam, sewage, hazardous liquids, and other similar		
22		substances. Privately owned and operated underground facilities which do not extend		
23		beyond the boundary of the private property are excluded.		

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1	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 49-23-03 of the North
2	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
3	a. Submitting the information required by the notification center before an
4	underground facility is put into service to allow the center to notify the operator of
5	excavation activity;
6	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 49-23-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7	amended and reenacted as follows:
8	49-23-04. Excavation.
9	1. Except in an emergency, an excavator shall contact:
10	a. White mark the excavation as required by the notification center.
11	b. Contact the notification center and provide an excavation or location notice at
12	least forty-eight hours before beginning any excavation, excluding Saturdays,
13	Sundays, and holidays, unless otherwise agreed to between the excavator and
14	operator. If an operator determines more time is necessary for location, the
15	operator may request a twenty-four-hour extension of the excavation or location
16	notice by notifying the notification center. The notification center shall notify the
17	excavator of the extension. An excavation begins the first time excavation occurs
18	in an area that was not previously identified by the excavator in an excavation
19	notice. The
20	c. Include in the notice-must contain:
21	a. (1) The name, address, and telephone number of the person making the
22	notification;
23	b. (2) The name, address, and telephone number of the excavator;
24	c. (3) The date and time when excavation is scheduled to begin;
25	d. (4) The depth of planned excavation;
26	e. (5) The type and extent of excavation being planned, including whether the
27	excavation involves tunneling or horizontal boring;
28	f. (6) Whether the use of explosives is anticipated and any other information as
29	may be required by the notification center; and
30	g. (7) The location of the excavation by any one or more of the following means:
31	(1)(a) A specific street address;

1				(2)(b) A reference to a platted lot number of record; or
2				(3)(c) A specific quarter section by section number, range, township, and
3				county. In this case, the location shall be further described by
4				coordinates measured in feet from the nearest one-fourth corner or
5				section corner.
6	2	2.	The	notification center shall:
7			a.	Provide a toll-free telephone number and assign an inquiry identification number
8				to each excavation notice and retain a record of all excavation notices received
9				for at least six years.
10			b.	Immediately transmit the information contained in an excavation notice to every
11				operator that has an underground facility in the area of the proposed excavation.
12			C.	Inform the persons giving notice of an intent to engage in an excavation activity
13				the names of participating operators of underground facilities to whom the notice
14				will be given.
15			d.	Establish procedures for assuring positive response from the affected operator in
16				all-emergency excavation notices.
17	3	3.	a.	An operator, within forty-eight hours, or any extension of that period, after
18				receiving an excavation notice from the center, excluding Saturdays, Sundays,
19				and holidays, unless otherwise agreed to between the excavator and operator,
20				shall locate and mark or otherwise provide the approximate horizontal location of
21				the underground facilities of the operator.
22			b.	For purposes of this section, the approximate horizontal location of the
23				underground facilities is a strip of land two feet [60.96 centimeters] on either side
24				of the underground facilities. This subdivision does not apply to an underground
25				facility to convey water.
26			C.	When an operator cannot establish the exact location of the underground facility
27				to convey water, the operator shall mark the location as accurately as possible
28				and the excavator may proceed with caution. When excavation operations
29				approach the estimated location of the underground facility to convey water, the
30				exact location of the facility must be determined by safe and acceptable means.
31				The uncovered facility must be supported and protected to prevent damage.

1	d.	Markers used to designate the approximate location of underground facilities
2		must follow the current color code standard used by the American public works
3		association.
4	e.	If the operator cannot complete marking of the excavation area before the
5		excavation commencement time stated in the excavation notice, the operator
6		shall promptly contact the excavator.
7	f.	After facilities are located by an operator, an excavator shall notify the notification
8		center if:
9		(1) The excavator postpones the excavation commencement time stated in the
10		excavation notice by more than forty-eight hours, or any extension of that
11		period, or cancels the excavation;
12		(2) The markings have been obliterated or obscured;
13		(3) Weather conditions have impeded visibility of the markings;
14		(4) The site shows evidence of recent excavation; or
15		(5) The excavator has other reason to believe the markings are incorrect or
16		missing.
17	g.	An excavator may not use a location more than ten days, or any extension of that
18		period, after the planned excavation date unless the excavator has made
19		previous arrangements with the operators affected.
20	h.	If in the course of excavation the excavator is unable to locate the underground
21		facility or discovers that the operator of the underground facility has incorrectly
22		located the underground facility, or discovers a previously unidentified
23		underground facility, the excavator shall promptly notify the operator or, if
24		unknown, the one-call notification center.
25	i.	A facility owner, excavator, or other person may not present or presume that an
26		underground facility is abandoned, or treat an underground facility as abandoned,
27		unless the facility has been verified as abandoned by reference to installation
28		records or by testing. The notification center shall establish a method of providing
29		personnel from a facility owner qualified to safely inspect and verify whether a
30		facility is abandoned or inactive if necessary. An inactive facility must be
31		considered active for purposes of this section.

1	4.	If an excavation is being made in a time of emergency, all reasonable precautions
2		must be taken to protect the underground facilities. In an emergency, the excavator
3		shall give notification in compliance with this chapter, as soon as practical, that an
4		emergency exists. As soon as practical, each operator shall provide all location
5		information that is reasonably available to the excavator.
