1	A concurrent resolution for the amendment of section 24 of article X of the Constitution of North			
2	Dakota, relating to the distribution of income from the foundation aid stabilization fund; and to			
3	provide an effective date.			
4	STATEMENT OF INTENT			
5	This measure would require that the interest and other income from the foundation aid			
6	stabilization fund be used to provide scholarships to academically qualified students attending			
7	accredited institutions of higher education in this state.			
8	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF			
9	REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:			
10	That the following proposed amendment to section 24 of article X of the Constitution of			
11	North Dakota is agreed to and must be submitted to the qualified electors of North Dakota at the			
12	general election to be held in 2012, in accordance with section 16 of article IV of the			
13	Constitution of North Dakota.			
14	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 24 of Article X of the Constitution of North Dakota is			
15	amended and reenacted as follows:			
16	Section 24.			
17	<u>1.</u>	Twen	ty percent of the revenue from oil extraction taxes from taxable oil produced in	
18		this s	tate must be allocated as follows:	
19	<del>1.</del>	<u>a.</u> I	Fifty percent must be deposited in the common schools trust fund-; and	
20	<del>2.</del>	<u>b.</u> I	Fifty percent must be deposited in the foundation aid stabilization fund in the	
21		(	state treasury, the.	
22	<u>2.</u>	<u>Any</u> ir	nterest or other income of whichgenerated by the foundation aid stabilization fund	
23	must be transferred to the state general fund on July first of each year and must be			
24	used, in part, to provide scholarships to academically qualified students attending			
25		accre	dited institutions of higher education in this state.	

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1	3. The amount available annually for each scholarship must be equal to at least twenty		
2	percent, but may not exceed fifty percent, of the statewide average undergraduate		
3	tuition and fees at the four-year public institutions of higher education in this state. Any		
4	amount not necessary for the purpose of scholarships is available for appropriation by		
5	the legislative assembly or for distribution by the legislative assembly to each resident		
6	of the state over the age of eighteen, notwithstanding the provisions of section 18 of		
7	article X of the Constitution of North Dakota.		
8	4. The principal of the foundation aid stabilization fund may be expended only upon order		
9	of the governor, who may direct such a transfer only to offset foundation aid reductions		
10	that were made by executive action pursuant to law due to a revenue shortage.		
11	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. If approved by the voters, this measure becomes effective		
12	on July 1, 2013.
