HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3032

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to study the needs of, economic 2 values of, and methods to improve access roadways to recreational, tourist, and historical sites 3 in North Dakota. 4 WHEREAS, the income and available funding through the special road fund created under 5 North Dakota Century Code Section 24-02-37 is inadequate to meet the local and statewide 6 needs to improve access roadways to recreational, tourist, and historical sites; and 7 WHEREAS, many existing access roadways are in a significant state of disrepair and are in 8 need of improvement--the condition typically relating to limited maintenance, inadequate base 9 materials and surfacing, narrow widths, and noncompliance with safety standards; and 10 WHEREAS, county and township funding is inadequate and severely stressed due to other 11 priority projects and needs, limiting local governments' ability to make the necessary investment 12 to improve these access roadways; and 13 WHEREAS, access roadways to recreational, tourist, and historical sites represent a local 14 and statewide value, as well as a substantial opportunity, as improvements will lead to 15 increased use resulting in added value and income to the local and state economies; and 16 WHEREAS, the projected population increases in this state, related to the expanding 17 energy industry and overall economic growth, will result in an increasing demand for 18 recreational opportunities; and 19 WHEREAS, the condition, use, need, and value of each access roadway varies; therefore, 20 alternatives related to roadway surfacing, construction methodologies, and lifecycle costs 21 should be evaluated to determine which are most applicable to the various locations; 22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF 23 NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

improve access roadways to recreational, tourist, and historical sites in North Dakota; and

That the Legislative Management study the needs of, economic values of, and methods to

- 1 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this study focus on designated or named public or
- 2 privately developed recreational areas, potential funding requirements through the special road
- 3 fund or other appropriate funding method for the identified access roadway improvements, and
- 4 the ability of the local governmental entities to operate and maintain these improvements when
- 5 completed; and
- 6 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Legislative Management report its findings and
- 7 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 8 the Sixty-third Legislative Assembly.
