- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 43-11-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to exemption from cosmetology licensure; and to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 43-11-01, 43-11-0543-11-03, 43-11-04, and 43-11-06, subsection 7 of section 43-11-16,
- 4 and sections 43-11-17, 43-11-19, 43-11-21, 43-11-24, 43-11-25, 43-11-26, 43-11-27, and
- 5 43-11-31 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the practice and licensing of
- 6 cosmetologists, cosmetology salons, estheticians, instructors, manicurists, and schools and the
- 7 powers, membership, and compensation of the state board of cosmetology; to repeal section-
- 8 43-11-28 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fees; and to provide an effective date.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 10 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 11 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 12 43-11-01. Definitions.

- 13 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 14 1. "Board" means the state board of cosmetology.
- 15 2. "Cosmetologist" means an individual licensed under this chapter to practice 16 cosmetology.
- "Cosmetology" means any one or combination of practices generally and usually 3. 18 performed by and known as the occupation of beauty culturists or cosmeticians or 19 cosmetologists or hairdressers, or of any other person holding out as practicing 20 cosmetology by whatever designation and within the meaning of this chapter and in
- 21 and upon whatever place or premises; and in particular cosmetology includes the
- 22 following or any one or a combination of practices: arranging, dressing, curling,
- 23 waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching, coloring, or similar work, upon the hair
- 24 of any person by any means or with hands or mechanical or electrical apparatus or

1 appliances, or by the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams, 2 or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising, waxing to 3 remove hair, beautifying, or similar work on the body, or manicuring the nails of any 4 person. 5 3.4. "Cosmetology salon" includes that part of any building in which the occupation of a 6 cosmetologist is practiced. 7 4.5. "Esthetician" means a person who is licensed by the board to engage in the practice of 8 skin care. An esthetician does not include a professional make-up artist trained in 9 facial make-up application by a cosmetics company. 10 5.6. "Homebound" means any person who is ill, disabled, or otherwise unable to travel to a 11 salon. 12 6.7. "Instructor" means any person of the age of eighteen years or more, who is a licensed 13 cosmetologist, who teaches cosmetology or any practices taught in a duly registered 14 school of cosmetology, and who has met the requirements of section 43-11-27 and 15 has applied for and received an instructor's license. 16 "Invasive care" means any procedure that invades the live tissue of the dermis. 7.8. 17 including: 18 a. Laser use, except the use of cold laser technology using nonlinear, pulsed light 19 application for the purpose of biostimulation without the generation of heat; and 20 Chemical peels, except for chemical peels using: b. 21 (1) Thirty percent alpha hydroxy acid, which includes glycolic acid with a pH of 22 3.0 or higher; 23 Twenty percent beta hydroxy acid, which includes salicylic acid with a pH of (2) 24 3.0 or higher; or 25 Two percent resorcinol with a pH of 3.0 or higher. 26 "Manager-operator" means any person who has met the requirements of section 8.9. 27 43-11-26 and has applied for and received a managing cosmetologist license. 28 9.10. "Manicuring" means the cleansing, cutting, shaping, beautifying, or massaging of the 29 hands, feet, or nails of any person. 30 10.11. "Manicurist" means a person who is licensed by the board to engage in the practice of 31 manicuring.

- Legislative Assembly 1 "Operator" means a person, not a student, who is licensed under the provisions of this 2 chapter to engage in and follow any of the practices of a hairdresser or cosmetologist. 3 12. "School of cosmetology" means an establishment operated for the purpose of teaching 4 cosmetology. 5 13. "Skin care" means the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, 6 creams, or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, waxing to 7 remove hair, beautifying, or similar work on the body of any person. The term does not 8 include invasive care. 9 14. "Student" means any person who is engaged in the learning or acquiring of any or all 10 the practices of cosmetology and while so learning, performs or assists in any of the 11 practices of cosmetology in any school registered or licensed and under the immediate 12 supervision of an instructor licensed as such under this chapter. 13 15. "Student instructor" means a cosmetologist who is receiving instruction in teacher's 14 training in a duly registered school of cosmetology. 15 16. "Tuition" means the total cost of a person's cosmetology studies, and does not include 16 books or demonstration kits. 17 SECTION 2. A new subsection to section 43-11-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 18 created and enacted as follows: 19 Skin care provided under the supervision, control, and responsibility of a physician in 20 the hospital, clinic, or physician's office. 21 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 amended and reenacted as follows: 23 43-11-05. Officers of board - Powers - Rulemaking. 24 The members of the board annually shall elect a president and a secretary from the 25 members of the board. The president and the secretary may administer oaths. The board may 26 adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter, including rules establishing license, 27 application, examination, reexamination, renewal, late renewal, and administrative fees in 28 amounts necessary to compensate the board for administration and enforcement of this-
 - SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-11-03. State board of cosmetology - Appointment - Term - Removal.

The state board of cosmetology consists of three five members appointed by the governor for three years each, with their terms of office so arranged that one term expires no more than two terms expire on June thirtieth of each year. Each member shall qualify by taking the oath required of civil officers and shall hold office until a successor is appointed and qualified. The governor may remove from office a member for misconduct, malfeasance, neglect of duty in office, crime in office, gross incompetency, or habitual drunkenness. A vacancy on the board must be filled by appointment by the governor for the unexpired term.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-11-04. Members of board - Qualifications.

Each member of the board must be a citizen of this state and. Three of the members of the board must each be a licensed cosmetologist who has had at least three years' practical experience in the occupation. The other two members of the board must be citizen members.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-11-06. Compensation of members of board - How paid.

Each member of the board is entitled to receive compensation of one hundred dollars in the amount provided for members of the legislative management under section 54-35-10 for each day employed in the actual discharge of official duties, as determined by the board. The secretary of the board shall receive an annual salary of not more than thirteen thousand dollars to be fixed by the board, and necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of official duties. Expenses incurred by a board member in the performance of an official function are payable by the board pursuant to sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09. The compensation and expenses of all members of the board must be paid from the license fees and other sources of income of the board.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 43-11-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

23	reexamination practical examination twice must complete an additional one hundred sixty hours		
24	of training at a school of cosmetology before applying for a second reexamination.		
25	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is

28	The board may dispense with the examination of applicants for licenses to practice		
29	cosmetology and may grant licenses upon the payment of a fee for original licensure and the		
30	reciprocity fee provided in section 43-11-28 if all the following requirements are met:		

1.	The applicant has complied with the requirements for registration of the District of	
	Columbia, or another state, territory, foreign country, or province where the	
	requirements are equal substantially to those in force in this state at the time the	
	application for the license is filed; and.	
2.	The applicant passes to the satisfaction of the board an examination on sanitary	
	practices and cosmetology law in this state.	
SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-26 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
amended and reenacted as follows:

SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is

1.	No person may be licensed as an instructor of cosmetology unless the person-	
	furnishes the board the examination fee set forth in section 43-11-28 and evidence of	
	having a general education equivalent to the completion of four years in high school.

	a. Shall have at least nine hundred sixty hours instructor's training in cosmetology in	
	a school of cosmetology. In no event may more than two thousand sixty hours	
	instructor's training be required for admission to examination. Under this-	
	subdivision the practical portion of the examination may be waived if the written	
	examination is supplemented with videotapes of the applicant's teaching-	
	procedures;

- b. Shall possess a current North Dakota license as a cosmetologist and must have been actively engaged in the practice of cosmetology for at least one year before application for an instructor's license, supplemented by not less than four hundred eighty hours instructor's training in a school of cosmetology or course of training approved by the board; or
- c. Shall possess a current North Dakota license as a cosmetologist and shall have been actively engaged in the practice of cosmetology for at least three years prior to application for an instructor's license supplemented by not less than one hundred sixty hours instructor's training in a school of cosmetology or course of training approved by the board. No instructor or student instructor may be permitted to practice cosmetology on a patron other than that part of practical work which pertains directly to the teaching of practical operations to students.
- 2. Student instructors in cosmetology must be registered upon enrollment in a school of cosmetology and upon certification by the school to the board of the name, age, and qualifications of the student instructor which must be recorded in a register kept for that purpose. A student instructor shall, at the time of enrollment, possess a general education equivalent to the completion of four years in high school and hold a license as a cosmetologist. Upon completion of the course prescribed for student instructors, the student instructor shall make application on a form provided by the board and paya fee as provided in section 43-11-28. The board shall thereupon cause the applicant to be examined for an instructor's license. The examination must be given by a special examining committee comprised of the board, assisted by one person designated by the board possessing the minimum qualifications entitling the person to instruct in an institution of higher learning and who shall examine the applicant in teaching procedures only. Upon successfully passing the examination the board shall issue an instructor's license to the applicant.
 - 3. No person is entitled to renew an instructor's license unless the instructor has furnished to the board evidence of completion of the continuing education established by the board by rule.

SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

Is addicted Addiction to the use of intoxicating liquor or drugs to such an extent as to 11 render the person unfit to practice cosmetology; 12 5. Advertises Advertising by means of knowingly false or deceptive statements; 13 6. Fails Failure to display the license as provided in this chapter; or. 14 7. Violates Violation of the provisions of this chapter or the rules adopted by the board. 15 8. Permitting an unlicensed person to practice cosmetology, manicuring, skin care, or 16 teaching in a cosmetology salon or school of cosmetology. 17 SECTION 14. REPEAL. Section 43-11-28 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.

SECTION 15. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 14 of this Act becomes effective on January 1,
