1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 43-11-02 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to exemption from cosmetology licensure; and to amend and reenact

3 sections 43-11-01, <u>43-11-05</u>43-11-03, 43-11-04, and 43-11-06, subsection 7 of section 43-11-16,

4 and sections 43-11-17, 43-11-19, 43-11-21, 43-11-24, 43-11-25, and 43-11-26,

- 5 43-11-27 subdivision b of subsection 1 of section 43-11-28, and section 43-11-31 of the North
- 6 Dakota Century Code, relating to <u>fees</u>, the practice and licensing of cosmetologists,
- 7 cosmetology salons, estheticians, instructors, manicurists, and schools, and the powers,
- 8 <u>membership</u>, and compensation of the state board of cosmetology; to repeal section 43-11-28
- 9 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fees; and to provide an effective date.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

11 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

12 amended and reenacted as follows:

13 **43-11-01. Definitions.**

- 14 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 15 1. "Board" means the state board of cosmetology.
- 16 2. <u>"Cosmetologist" means an individual licensed under this chapter to practice</u>
 17 <u>cosmetology.</u>
- <u>3.</u> "Cosmetology" means any one or combination of practices generally and usually
 performed by and known as the occupation of beauty culturists or cosmeticians or
 cosmetologists or hairdressers, or of any other person holding out as practicing
- 21 cosmetology by whatever designation and within the meaning of this chapter and in
- and upon whatever place or premises; and in particular cosmetology includes the
- following or any one or a combination of practices: arranging, dressing, curling,
- 24 waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching, coloring, or similar work, upon the hair

1		of any person by any means or with hands or mechanical or electrical apparatus or	
2		appliances, or by the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams,	
3		or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising, waxing to	
4		remove hair, beautifying, or similar work on the body, or manicuring the nails of any	
5		person.	
6	3.<u>4.</u>	"Cosmetology salon" includes that part of any building in which the occupation of a	
7		cosmetologist is practiced.	
8	<u>4.5.</u>	"Esthetician" means a person who is licensed by the board to engage in the practice of	
9		skin care. An esthetician does not include a professional make-up artist trained in	
10		facial make-up application by a cosmetics company.	
11	<u>5.6.</u>	"Homebound" means any person who is ill, disabled, or otherwise unable to travel to a	
12		salon.	
13	6.<u>7.</u>	"Instructor" means any person of the age of eighteen years or more, who is a licensed	
14		cosmetologist, who teaches cosmetology or any practices taught in a duly registered	
15		school of cosmetology, and who has met the requirements of section 43-11-27 and	
16		has applied for and received an instructor's license.	
17	7.<u>8.</u>	"Invasive care" means any procedure that invades the live tissue of the dermis,	
18		including:	
19		a. Laser use, except the use of cold laser technology using nonlinear, pulsed light	
20		application for the purpose of biostimulation without the generation of heat; and	
21		b. Chemical peels, except for chemical peels using:	
22		(1) Thirty percent alpha hydroxy acid, which includes glycolic acid with a pH of	
23		3.0 or higher;	
24		(2) Twenty percent beta hydroxy acid, which includes salicylic acid with a pH of	
25		3.0 or higher; or	
26		(3) Two percent resorcinol with a pH of 3.0 or higher.	
27	8.<u>9.</u>	"Manager-operator" means any person who has met the requirements of section	
28		43-11-26 and has applied for and received a managing cosmetologist license.	
29	9.<u>10.</u>	"Manicuring" means the cleansing, cutting, shaping, beautifying, or massaging of the	
30		hands, feet, or nails of any person.	

- 1 <u>10.11.</u> "Manicurist" means a person who is licensed by the board to engage in the practice of
 manicuring.
- 3 11. "Operator" means a person, not a student, who is licensed under the provisions of this
 4 chapter to engage in and follow any of the practices of a hairdresser or cosmetologist.
- 5 12. "School of cosmetology" means an establishment operated for the purpose of teaching6 cosmetology.
- 7 13. "Skin care" means the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions,
 8 creams, or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, waxing to
 9 remove hair, beautifying, or similar work on the body of any person. The term does not
 10 include invasive care.
- 14. "Student" means any person who is engaged in the learning or acquiring of any or all
 the practices of cosmetology and while so learning, performs or assists in any of the
 practices of cosmetology in any school registered or licensed and under the immediate
 supervision of an instructor licensed as such under this chapter.
- 15. "Student instructor" means a cosmetologist who is receiving instruction in teacher's
 training in a duly registered school of cosmetology.
- 17 16. "Tuition" means the total cost of a person's cosmetology studies, and does not include18 books or demonstration kits.
- 19 SECTION 2. A new subsection to section 43-11-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 20 created and enacted as follows:
- 21 <u>Skin care provided under the supervision, control, and responsibility of a physician in</u>
 22 <u>the hospital, clinic, or physician's office.</u>
- 23 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 24 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 25 43-11-05. Officers of board Powers Rulemaking.
- 26 The members of the board annually shall elect a president and a secretary from the-
- 27 members of the board. The president and the secretary may administer oaths. The board may
- 28 adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter. including rules establishing license,
- 29 application, examination, renewal, late renewal, and administrative fees in-
- 30 <u>amounts necessary to compensate the board for administration and enforcement of this</u>
- 31 <u>chapter.</u>

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1	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	43-11-03. State board of cosmetology - Appointment - Term - Removal.
4	The state board of cosmetology consists of three five members appointed by the governor
5	for three years each, with their terms of office so arranged that one term expires no more than
6	two terms expire on June thirtieth of each year. Each member shall qualify by taking the oath
7	required of civil officers and shall hold office until a successor is appointed and qualified. The
8	governor may remove from office a member for misconduct, malfeasance, neglect of duty in
9	office, crime in office, gross incompetency, or habitual drunkenness. A vacancy on the board
10	must be filled by appointment by the governor for the unexpired term.
11	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
12	amended and reenacted as follows:
13	43-11-04. Members of board - Qualifications.
14	Each member of the board must be a citizen of this state and. Three of the members of the
15	board must each be a licensed cosmetologist who has had at least three years' practical
16	experience in the occupation. The other two members of the board must be citizen members, at
17	least one of whom has professional experience as a secondary teacher or as a postsecondary
18	educator.
19	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
20	amended and reenacted as follows:
21	43-11-06. Compensation of members of board - How paid.
22	Each member of the board is entitled to receive compensation of one hundred dollarsin the
23	amount provided for members of the legislative management under section 54-35-10 for each
24	day employed in the actual discharge of official duties, as determined by the board. The-
25	secretary of the board shall receive an annual salary of not more than thirteen thousand dollars-
26	to be fixed by the board, and necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of official
27	duties. Expenses incurred by a board member in the performance of an official function are
28	payable by the board pursuant to sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09. The compensation and
29	expenses of all members of the board must be paid from the license fees and other sources of
30	income of the board.

1	SECTI	ON 6. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 43-11-16 of the North Dakota Century	
2	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

9		the total hours of instruction required by this chapter; or	
10	c.<u>b</u>.	Compensate any of its basic students in any way; and

15	The bo	ard may issue an annual license for a school of cosmetology. The annual registration	
16	fee for a sc	hool must be determined by the board, as set forth in section 43-11-28 by rule. The	
17	board shall	, after inspection and approval, issue a salon license, the annual fee for which must	
18	be determii	ned by the board, as set forth in section 43-11-28 by rule.	
19		ON 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
20	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
21		9. Students - Registration.	
22	— A stude	ent cosmetologist must:	
23	<u> </u>	dhere to the laws and rules regarding the practice of cosmetology;	
24	<u> 2. H</u>	ave educational qualifications equivalent to completion of four years of high school;

27	re	quirements thereof.	
28	The names	and qualifications of all students must be certified to the board by each school of	
29	cosmetolog	y. The certification must be accompanied by a processing fee for each student in an-	
30	amount as	may be fixed by the board under section 43-11-28by rule.	

1	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
2	amended and reenacted as follows:			
3	43-1	43-11-21. Operator'sCosmetologist license - Examination required - Application -		
4	Examination - Fees.			
5	Each person who desires to secure an operator'sa cosmetologist license shall file with the			
6	secretary of the board a written application under oath on a form supplied by the board. The			
7	application must be accompanied by all of the following:			
8	1.	Satisfactory proof of the educational qualifications required of a student;		
9	2.	An examination fee as may be fixed by the board pursuant to section 43-11-28; by rule.		
10	3.	Satisfactory proof that the applicant has completed the required training in a school of		
11	L	cosmetology ; and .		
12	4.	A fee for original licensure as required by section 43-11-28rule.		
13	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
14	amende	d and reenacted as follows:		
15	43-1	I1-24. Operator's<u>Cosmetologist</u> license - When issued - Failure to pass		
16	examination - Reexamination - Retraining.			
17	An (operator's A cosmetologist license must be issued to any person who has met all the		
18	<u>following</u>	g requirements:		
19	1.	Complied with section 43-11-21; and.		
20	2.	Passed to the satisfaction of the board the examination of applicants for a license to		
21		practice under this chapter.		
22	If the applicant fails to pass the examination, the examination fee may not be returned. If an			
23	applicant fails to pass an examination, the applicant may be examined again with the payment			
24	of a reexamination fee as set forth in section 43-11-28. An applicant who fails to pass the first-			
25	reexamination practical examination twice must complete an additional one hundred sixty hours			
26	of training at a school of cosmetology before applying for a second reexamination.			
27	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
28	amended and reenacted as follows:			

1	43-11-25. License issued without examination - Conditions.		
2	The board may dispense with the examination of applicants for licenses to practice		
3	cosmetology and may grant licenses upon the payment of a fee for original licensure and the		
4	reciprocity fee provided in section 43-11-28 if all the following requirements are met:		
5	1.	The applicant has complied with the requirements for registration of the District of	
6		Columbia, or another state, territory, foreign country, or province where the	
7		requirements are equal substantially to those in force in this state at the time the	
8		application for the license is filed; and.	
9	2.	The applicant passes to the satisfaction of the board an examination on sanitary	
10		practices and cosmetology law in this state.	
11	SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-26 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
12	amende	d and reenacted as follows:	
13	43-11-26. Manager-operator - License - Qualifications.		
14	A personAn individual may obtain a manager-operator's license upon meeting all the		
15	following	g requirements:	
16	1.	Furnishing to the board evidence of having practiced as a licensed	
17		operatorcosmetologist for at least one hundred twenty-five days;one thousand hours.	
18	2.	Paying an original licensure fee as set forth in section 43-11-28; and.	
19	3.	Complying with the other requirements of this chapter applicable to a	
20		manager-operator.	
21		TION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is-	
22	amended and reenacted as follows:		
23	— 43- 1	1-27. Instructor's license - Student instructor's license - Registration -	
24	Qualifications.		
25	<u> </u>	No person may be licensed as an instructor of cosmetology unless the person-	
26		furnishes the board the examination fee set forth in section 43-11-28 and evidence of	
27		having a general education equivalent to the completion of four years in high school.	
28		An applicant:	
29		a. Shall have at least nine hundred sixty hours instructor's training in cosmetology in-	
30		a school of cosmetology. In no event may more than two thousand sixty hours-	
31		instructor's training be required for admission to examination. Under this	

1	subdivision the practical portion of the examination may be waived if the written
2	examination is supplemented with videotapes of the applicant's teaching
3	procedures;
4	b. Shall possess a current North Dakota license as a cosmetologist and must have
5	been actively engaged in the practice of cosmetology for at least one year before
6	application for an instructor's license, supplemented by not less than four
7	hundred eighty hours instructor's training in a school of cosmetology or course of
8	training approved by the board; or
9	
10	been actively engaged in the practice of cosmetology for at least three years prior
11	to application for an instructor's license supplemented by not less than one-
12	hundred sixty hours instructor's training in a school of cosmetology or course of
13	training approved by the board. No instructor or student instructor may be-
14	permitted to practice cosmetology on a patron other than that part of practical
15	work which pertains directly to the teaching of practical operations to students.
16	2. Student instructors in cosmetology must be registered upon enrollment in a school of
17	cosmetology and upon certification by the school to the board of the name, age, and
18	qualifications of the student instructor which must be recorded in a register kept for-
19	that purpose. A student instructor shall, at the time of enrollment, possess a general
20	education equivalent to the completion of four years in high school and hold a license
21	as a cosmetologist. Upon completion of the course prescribed for student instructors,
22	the student instructor shall make application on a form provided by the board and pay
23	a fee as provided in section 43-11-28. The board shall thereupon cause the applicant-
24	to be examined for an instructor's license. The examination must be given by a special
25	examining committee comprised of the board, assisted by one person designated by
26	the board possessing the minimum qualifications entitling the person to instruct in an
27	institution of higher learning and who shall examine the applicant in teaching
28	procedures only. Upon successfully passing the examination the board shall issue an-
29	instructor's license to the applicant.

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1		3. No person is entitled to renew an instructor's license unle	ess the instructor has
2		furnished to the board evidence of completion of the continui	ng education established
3		by the board by rule.
