- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact subsection 12 to section 55-08-01.3 and sections
- 2 55-08-18 and 55-08-19 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to parks and recreation
- 3 department rule violations and penalties; to amend and reenact section 55-08-17 and
- 4 subsection 13 of section 55-11-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to parks and
- 5 recreation department rule violations and penalties; and to provide a penalty.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. Subsection 12 to section 55-08-01.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 created and enacted as follows:
- 9 <u>12.</u> Establish noncriminal penalties for violation of rules adopted by the director. The

 maximum noncriminal penalty is a fine of two hundred fifty dollars. Department
- 11 personnel designated by the director shall have the power to enforce noncriminal
- 12 <u>violations of these rules. Fines collected for violation of these rules must be deposited</u>
- in the state park fund.

- SECTION 2. Section 55-08-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
 - 55-08-18. Violations noncriminal Procedures.
- Any person who has been cited for a violation of this title or related rules may appear before
- 18 <u>a court of competent jurisdiction and pay the statutory fee at or prior to the time scheduled for a</u>
- 19 <u>hearing or, if bond has been posted, may forfeit the bond by not appearing at the scheduled</u>
- 20 <u>time. A person appearing at the time scheduled in the citation may make a statement in</u>
- 21 <u>explanation of that person's action and the judge may at that time waive, reduce, or suspend</u>
- 22 the statutory fee or bond, or both. If the person cited follows the foregoing procedures, that
- 23 person has admitted the violation and has waived the right to a hearing on the issue of
- 24 commission of the violation. The bond required to secure appearance before the judge must be

- 1 <u>identical to the administrative fee established by section 55-08-19. Within ten days after</u>
- 2 <u>forfeiture of bond or payment of the statutory fee, the judge shall certify to the director</u>
- 3 admission of the violation.
- 4 **SECTION 3.** Section 55-08-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as
- 5 follows:
- 6 <u>55-08-19. Amount of statutory fees.</u>
- The fees required for a noncriminal disposition pursuant to section 55-08-18 are as follows:
- 8 <u>1.</u> For a class 1 noncriminal offense, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- 9 <u>2.</u> For a class 2 noncriminal offense, a fee of fifty dollars.
- 10 <u>3.</u> For a class 3 noncriminal offense, a fee of twenty-five dollars.
- 11 <u>4. For violation of a rule approved by the director, the amount set in the rule, up to a</u>
 12 maximum of two hundred fifty dollars.
- 13 <u>5.</u> The director shall have the discretion to classify violations of parks and recreation
 14 <u>department rules.</u>
- SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 55-08-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 17 **55-08-17.** General penalty.
- Any person violating a provision of this chapter for which a penalty is not specifically provided is guilty of an infractiona noncriminal violation.
- 20 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 13 of section 55-11-09 of the North Dakota Century 21 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 22 13. To adopt and enforce suitable rules relating to the protection, care, and use of any
 23 state nature preserve or state-owned or state-managed natural area. The violation of
 24 any such rule constitutes an infraction. Enforcement of these rules shall comply with
 25 the powers granted in chapter 55-08.
