1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state department

2 of health; to provide a contingent appropriation; to amend and reenact section 54-27-25 of the

3 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the tobacco settlement trust fund; to provide legislative

4 intent; to provide for reports; and to provide for a legislative management study.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 7 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 8 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 9 other income, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 10 state department of health, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, 11 as follows:

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1 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO

one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

14 The 2011-13 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the

15 2013-15 biennium. The state department of health shall report to the appropriations committees

16 of the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium

17 beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 3. ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND. The estimated income line item included in section 1 of this Act includes \$272,310, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to be made available to the state department of health from the environment and rangeland protection fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. This amount includes \$50,000 for a grant to the North Dakota stockmen's association environmental services program.

24 SECTION 4. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION AND BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA LINE

25 OF CREDIT - LITIGATION AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS COSTS - REPORT TO

26 **BUDGET SECTION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state

treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$500,000, or so much of the sum as may be

- 28 necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying expenses associated
- 29 with possible litigation and other administrative proceedings involving the United States

30 environmental protection agency for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and

31 ending June 30, 2013. In addition, the state department of health, contingent on litigation and

1 administrative proceedings, may borrow the sum of \$500,000, or so much of the sum as may be 2 necessary, from the Bank of North Dakota, the proceeds of which is appropriated to the state 3 department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses associated with possible 4 litigation and other administrative proceedings involving the United States environmental 5 protection agency for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending 6 June 30, 2013. The department may spend the general fund moneys and access the line of 7 credit only upon approval by the attorney general. The department must report guarterly to the 8 budget section during the 2011-12 interim regarding the status of any litigation and other 9 administrative proceedings. 10 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 54-27-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is 11 amended and reenacted as follows: 12 54-27-25. Tobacco settlement trust fund - Interest on fund - Uses. 13 There is created in the state treasury a tobacco settlement trust fund. The fund 1. 14 consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained by the state under subsection IX(c) 15 (1) of the master settlement agreement and consent agreement adopted by the east 16 central judicial district court in its judgment entered December 28, 1998 [Civil 17 No. 98-3778] in State of North Dakota, ex rel. Heidi Heitkamp v. Philip Morris, Inc. 18 Except as provided in subsection 2, moneys received by the state under 19 subsection IX(c)(1) must be deposited in the fund. Interest earned on the fund must be 20 credited to the fund and deposited in the fund. The principal and interest of the fund 21 must be allocated as follows: 22 Transfers to a community health trust fund to be administered by the state a. 23 department of health. The state department of health may use funds as 24 appropriated for community-based public health programs and other public health 25 programs, including programs with emphasis on preventing or reducing tobacco 26 usage in this state. Transfers under this subsection must equal ten percent of 27 total annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund of which a minimum-28 of eighty percent must be used for tobacco prevention and control. 29 Transfers to the common schools trust fund to become a part of the principal of b. 30 that fund. Transfers under this subsection must equal forty-five percent of total 31 annual transfers from the tobacco settlement trust fund.

1	C.	Transfers to the water development trust fund to be used to address the
2		long-term water development and management needs of the state. Transfers
3		under this subsection must equal forty-five percent of the total annual transfers
4		from the tobacco settlement trust fund.

- 5 2. There is created in the state treasury a tobacco prevention and control trust fund. The 6 fund consists of the tobacco settlement dollars obtained by the state under section 7 IX(c)(2) of the agreement adopted by the east central judicial district court in its 8 judgment entered December 28, 1998 [Civil No. 98-3778] in State of North Dakota, 9 ex rel. Heidi Heitkamp v. Philip Morris, Inc. Interest earned on the fund must be 10 credited to the fund and deposited in the fund. Moneys received into the fund are to be 11 administered by the executive committee for the purpose of creating and implementing 12 the comprehensive plan. If in any biennium, the tobacco prevention and control trust 13 fund does not have adequate dollars to fund a comprehensive plan, the treasurer shall 14 transfer money from the water development trust fund to the tobacco prevention and 15 control trust fund in an amount equal to the amount determined necessary by the 16 executive committee to fund a comprehensive plan.
- 17 3. Transfers to the funds under this section must be made within thirty days of receipt by18 the state.

19 SECTION 6. INTENT - INDIRECT COST RECOVERIES. Notwithstanding section

54-44.1-15, the state department of health may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operatingaccount.

SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - SUICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAM. It is the intent
 of the legislative assembly that the state department of health work in conjunction with the
 Indian affairs commission to develop, implement, and coordinate a suicide prevention program,
 including outreach, education, and administration of grants for suicide prevention activities for
 the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - REGIONAL PUBLIC HEALTH
 NETWORK PILOT PROJECT. During the 2011-12 interim, the legislative management shall
 consider studying the regional public health network pilot project conducted during the 2009-11
 biennium, including services provided, effects of the project on participating local public health
 units, efficiencies achieved in providing services, cost-savings to state and local governments,

- 1 and possible improvements to the program. The legislative management shall report its findings
- 2 and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the
- 3 recommendations, to the sixty-third legislative assembly.
