- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information
- 2 technology department; to provide for an appropriation to the department of human services; to
- 3 provide for various transfers; to provide legislative intent; and to amend and reenact section 7 of
- 4 chapter 49 and section 8 of chapter 519 of the 2009 Session Laws, relating to statewide
- 5 longitudinal data system expenditures and health information technology.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the information technology department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$9,200,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, the sum of \$16,100,000, to the department of human services for the purpose of providing initial funding for an eligibility system replacement project, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. The department of human services is authorized one new full-time equivalent position for this project.

SECTION 3. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO SIXTY-THIRD LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding items approved by the sixty-first legislative assembly for the 2009-11 biennium and the 2011-13 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

5	2013-15 biennium. The information technology department shall report to the appropriations		
6	committees of the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the		
7	biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.		
8	SECTION 4. TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of the office of		
9	management and budget shall make transfers of funds between the salaries and wages,		
10	operating expenses, and capital assets line items in section 1 of this Act for the information		
11	technology department as may be requested by the chief information officer as determined		
12	necessary for the development and implementation of information projects.		
13	SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA PACE PROGRAM. It is		
14	the intent of the sixty-second legislative assembly that the Bank of North Dakota PACE program-		
15	be used to provide low-interest loans to finance projects of up to a total of \$5,000,000		
16	consistent with the mission of the health information technology planning loan fund and the		

amhealth information technology loan fund.

SECTION 5. BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA TRANSFER. The industrial commission shall transfer, as requested by the health information technology office director, up to \$5,000,000 from the current earnings and accumulated profits of the Bank of North Dakota to the health information technology planning loan fund or to the health information technology loan fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. The health information technology office director shall request transfers from the Bank only as necessary to meet cashflow needs of the fund and only upon certification by the health information technology office director of a demonstrated need for health information technology planning loans.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 7 of chapter 49 of the 2009 Session Laws is amended and reenacted as follows:

SECTION 7. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - STATEWIDE LONGITUDINAL DATA SYSTEM EXPENDITURES - APPROVAL. The department of public instruction may spend only the federal funds appropriated in House Bill No. 1013 for costs associated with the statewide longitudinal data system upon

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1 approval of the expenditures by the information technology department, for the 2 biennium beginning July 1, 20092011, and ending June 30, 20112013. 3 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 8 of chapter 519 of the 2009 Session Laws is 4 amended and reenacted as follows: 5 SECTION 8. BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA TRANSFERS. The industrial 6 commission shall transfer, during the period beginning with the effective date of this 7 Act and ending June 30, 2011/2013, as requested by the health information technology 8 office director, up to \$8,000,000 from the current earnings and the accumulated 9 undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota to the health information technology loan 10 fund to meet any required match for federal funds or to the electronic health 11 information exchange fund to meet any required match for federal funds or for ongoing 12 operating expenditures of the health information exchange or as directed, a portion to 13 both funds to meet any required match for federal funds. The health information-14 technology office director shall request fund transfers from the Bank only as necessary

to comply with federal requirements and to meet cash flow needs of the funds.
