A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind, and the state library; to provide for the distribution of funding for regional education association grants, alternative education programcontinuing education grants, gifted and talented programs and medicaid matching funds, and other grants; to provide a contingent appropriation; to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota teacher of the year award; to amend and reenact section 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the superintendent of public instruction; to repeal section 15.1-13-33 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the national board certification fund; to provide an exemption; to provide for a transfer; to amend and reenact sections 54 and 59 of chapter 175 of the 2009 Session Laws, relating to funds appropriated for transportation and state school aid; to amend and reenact section 16 of chapter 13 of the 2009 Session Laws, relating to contingent supplemental transportation aid payments; to provide a statement of legislative intent; to provide for reports to the budget section and sixty-third legislative assembly; and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:

The 2011-13 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 2013-15 biennium. The department of public instruction, school for the deaf, and school for the blind - vision services shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - LANDS AND MINERALS TRUST FUND - STATE

BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the lands and minerals trust fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of providing North Dakota academic and career and technical education scholarships, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

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1	SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from special funds derived from				
2	federal funds the sum of \$30,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the				
3	superintendent of public instruction for grants for the period beginning with the effective date of				
4	this Act and ending June 30, 2011.				
5	SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$101,638,000,				
6	included in the grants - state school aid line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is from				
7	the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund that				
8	becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of public				
9	instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.				
10	SECTION 5. MILL LEVY REDUCTION GRANTS - FUNDING FROM PROPERTY TAX				
11	RELIEF FUND. The grants - mill levy reduction and estimated income line items contained in				
12	subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act include \$341,790,000 from the property tax relief				
13	sustainability fund which is appropriated to the department of public instruction for the purpose				
14	of providing mill levy reduction grants to school districts during the biennium beginning July 1,				
15	2011, and ending June 30, 2013.				
16	SECTION 6. STATE SCHOOL AID AND SPECIAL EDUCATION CONTRACTS				
17	EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may expend funds				
18	included in the grants - state school aid and grants - special education contracts line items in				
19	subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational services that were due				
20	in the 2009-11 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly supported by the				
21	education provider until after June 30, 2011.				
22	SECTION 7. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS. During the 2011-13				
23	biennium, the superintendent of public instruction shall expend up to \$800,000 from the grants -				
24	state school aid line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for the purpose of providing an				
25	annual grant to each eligible regional education association in order to assist each association				
26	with the cost of compensating a coordinator.				
27	1. In order to receive a grant under this section, each regional education association				
28	must:				
29	a. Enter a contract with an individual to serve as a coordinator, on a full-time or a				

part-time basis, for a duration of at least twelve months; and

- Provide from other revenue sources at least thirty percent of the total compensation payable to the coordinator.
- 2. The maximum grant payable to a regional education association under this section during each year of the biennium is the lesser of \$50,000 or seventy percent of the total compensation payable to the coordinator.

SECTION 8. RESERVED FUNDS - CONTINGENT ADULT EDUCATION LEARNING

CENTER GRANTS. The sum of \$500,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, made available under section 19 of this Act, must be used by the department of public instruction for providing adult education learning center grants, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. The department may provide grants of up to \$250,000 during the first year of the biennium only if federal funding available to the state for adult education is less than \$900,000 in federal fiscal year 2012. Funding provided in the first year of the biennium is limited to the difference between federal funding available in federal fiscal year 2012 and \$900,000. The department may use any remaining funds for adult education learning center grants during the second year of the biennium.

SECTION 9. CONTINUING EDUCATION GRANTS - FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION. The sum of \$100,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the grants - other grants line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act is provided for continuing education grants, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

- 1. The superintendent of public instruction shall award grants in amounts up to \$1,200 to eligible recipients in chronological order, based on the date of an individual's application. An eligible recipient must:
 - a. (1) Be licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board;
 - (2) Have taught in this state during each of the last three school years; and
 - (3) Be enrolled at an institution of higher education in this state in either a master of education program in educational leadership or a program leading to a specialist diploma in educational leadership;
 - Be pursuing the requirements for a certificate in career development facilitation;
 or
 - c. Be pursuing a school counselor credential.

If any of the amount appropriated for this purpose remains after the superintendent of
public instruction has awarded grants to all eligible recipients, the superintendent shall
distribute that amount as an additional per student payment on a prorated basis,
according to the latest available average daily membership of each school district.

SECTION 8. ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM GRANTS - FUNDING -

DISTRIBUTION. The sum of \$460,000, included in the grants - other education line item insubdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act must be distributed for the purpose of providing payments to eligible school districts that offer alternative education programs to students in grades six through eight, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. In order to determine the payment per student, the superintendent of public instruction shall multiply the number of full-time equivalent students in grades six through eight who are enrolled during the 2012-13 school year in an average of at least fifteen hours per week of alternative education programming by a weighting factor that may not exceed 0.20.

SECTION 10. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - <u>MEDICAID MATCHING -</u> FUNDING - DISTRIBUTION.

- 1. The sum of \$800,000, included in the grants state school aid line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts and special education units.
 - State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for students participating in the medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special education unit must be paid by the superintendent of public instruction to the department of human services on behalf of the school district or unit.

SECTION 10. TEACHER OF THE YEAR PROGRAM. The department of public instruction shall administer a teacher of the year program for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. The department of public instruction shall assign responsibility to its-

department staff to coordinate the annual event, including preparation of application materials, distribution of materials to the selection committee, publicity, and planning of the event at which the recipient of the award is announced. The selection committee appointed by the department of public instruction may not include more than one representative from any education-related organization or association.

SECTION 11. INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-15, the department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating account.

SECTION 12. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,500,000 for aid to public libraries, of which no more than one-half is to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2012.

SECTION 13. FEES DEPOSITED IN VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND OPERATING FUND. Any moneys included in the estimated income line item in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be deposited in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state treasury and may be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly.

SECTION 14. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - EXEMPTION - TRANSFER. Up to \$835,000 of the amount appropriated to the school for the deaf from the general fund, as provided in chapter 13 of the 2009 Session Laws, for the trades building remodeling project and not spent or obligated as of June 30, 2011, is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 and shall be transferred by the director of the office of management and budget to the school for the deaf fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013.

SECTION 15. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT PROGRAM. The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher education with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or hard of hearing for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. Moneys appropriated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds shall be distributed pursuant to the provisions of this section:

 The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on a uniform hourly reimbursement.

Sixty-second Legislative Assembly 1 To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the 2 deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the 3 amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf 4 or hard of hearing. 5 3. The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount 6 appropriated during the first year of the biennium. 7 If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the 8 deaf shall provide additional prorated grants to institutions that incurred during the 9 biennium hourly expenses in excess of the formula reimbursement level. 10 At the request of an institution under the control of the state board of higher education, 11 the school for the deaf shall consult with the institution and provide advice regarding 12 the provision of services most appropriate to meet a student's needs. 13 SECTION 16. A new section to chapter 15.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 14 created and enacted as follows: 15 North Dakota teacher of the year award - Selection - Announcement. 16 17 18 19

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- The superintendent of public instruction shall administer a teacher of the year program. The superintendent of public instruction shall coordinate the annual event, including preparation of application materials, distribution of materials to the selection committee, and publicity arrangements for the North Dakota teacher of the year award.
- By September thirtieth of each year, the governor and the superintendent of public instruction shall jointly announce the award recipient and serve as the exclusive hosts of a ceremony and reception honoring the teacher of the year. The ceremony and reception must take place in the memorial hall of the state capitol or, if requested by the award recipient, at a location in the municipality within which the recipient resides or works.
- The selection committee must be appointed by the superintendent of public instruction and may not include more than one representative from any education-related organization or association.

SECTION 16. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - SCHOOL DISTRICT DEFERRED **MAINTENANCE AND PHYSICAL PLANT IMPROVEMENT GRANTS.**

 - <u>b.</u> Reserve the next five hundred thousand dollars, which is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11 and must be used in accordance with section 8 of this Act.
 - c. Use the money to provide additional per student payments on a prorated basis according to the latest available average daily membership of each school district.

SECTION 20. TRANSFER - NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION FUND - GENERAL

FUND. The office of management and budget shall transfer any balance remaining in the national board certification fund at the end of the 2011-13 biennium to the general fund. For purposes of this section, "at the end of the 2011-13 biennium" means after cancellation of unexpended appropriations under section 54-44.1-1154-44.1-11.

SECTION 21. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - 2013-15 SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF

APPROPRIATION BILL. It is the intent of the sixty-second legislative assembly that the

1 governor include the recommended funding for the school for the deaf in a separate draft 2 appropriations act for introduction to the sixty-third legislative assembly. 3 SECTION 22. REPORT TO THE BUDGET SECTION AND THE SIXTY-THIRD 4 **LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The superintendent of public instruction shall provide a report to 5 the budget section by September 30, 2012 and to the sixty-third legislative assembly on the 6 development of alternative teacher compensation plans. The report must include use of the 7 funding, number of plans developed, summary of plan variances, criteria for teacher 8 performance review, and recommendations. 9 SECTION 23. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 10 amended and reenacted as follows: 11 15.1-02-02. Salary. 12 The annual salary of the superintendent of public instruction is ninety-five one hundred two 13 thousand eneeight hundred sixteensixty-eight dollars through June 30, 20102012, and 14 ninety-nineone hundred five thousand eightnine hundred seventy-twofifty-four dollars thereafter. 15 SECTION 24. REPEAL. Section 15.1-13-33 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed. 16 SECTION 25. EMERGENCY. Sections 3, 17, and 184,17, 18, and 19 of this Act and 17 \$21,517,716 appropriated in the education jobs fund line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of 18 this Act are declared to be an emergency measure.
