- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to prevention of bullying in schools.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

- 8 <u>a. "Bullying" means conduct occurring or received at school, including through</u>
  9 technology or electronic means:
- 10 (1) That is so severe, pervasive, or objectively offensive that it substantially

  11 interferes with or impairs a student's educational opportunities or

  12 benefits:
  - (2) That has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the school; or
    - (3) That places a student in actual and reasonable fear of harm to the student's person or damage to the student's property.
    - b. "School" includes a classroom or other location on school premises, a schoolbus or other school-related vehicle, a schoolbus stop, an activity or event sponsored by a school, whether or not it is held on school premises, and any other program or function where the school is responsible for the child.
  - 2. A person may not engage in bullying or reprisal or retaliation against a victim, witness, or person who reports information about an act of bullying.

10		<u>b.</u>	The	e policy prohibiting bullying shall include, without limitation:
11			<u>(1)</u>	A statement prohibiting bullying of a student;
12			<u>(2)</u>	A definition of bullying which includes, at a minimum, the definition as
13				provided in this section;
14			<u>(3)</u>	A provision that there will be consequences and appropriate remedial
15				actions for persons committing acts of bullying, or engaging in reprisal or
16				retaliation;
17			<u>(4)</u>	Procedures for reporting and documenting acts of bullying, including a
18				provision for reporting anonymously. However, formal disciplinary action
19				shall not be taken solely on the basis of an anonymous report. The
20				procedures shall identify the appropriate school personnel responsible
21				for receiving a report and investigating a complaint, as well as a
22				schedule for document retention;
23			<u>(5)</u>	Procedures for prompt investigation of reports or complaints of serious
24				violations. These procedures shall include a requirement that school
25				personnel notify local law enforcement immediately if the initial school
26				investigation creates a reasonable suspicion that a crime may have
27				occurred;
28			<u>(6)</u>	A provision that prohibits reprisal or retaliation against a person who
29				reports or makes a complaint of bullying;
30			<u>(7)</u>	A provision that the school will develop a strategy for protecting a victim
31				from additional bullying, and from retaliation following a report;

1			<u>(8)</u>	A provision that there will be consequences and appropriate remedial	
2				action for a person who is found to have made a false accusation, report,	
3				or complaint;	
4			<u>(9)</u>	A method for discussing the district's bullying policy with students; and	
5			<u>(10)</u>	A statement of how the policy is to be publicized, including notice that	
6				the policy applies to participation in functions sponsored by the school.	
7		<u>C.</u>	<u>To a</u>	assist local school districts in developing a policy under this subsection,	
8			<u>the</u>	department of public instruction, North Dakota school boards association,	
9			<u>and</u>	education standards and practices board shall not later than	
10			<u>Dec</u>	ember 31, 2011, develop model policies applicable to kindergarten	
11			<u>thro</u>	ugh grade twelve and teacher preparation program standards on the	
12			<u>ider</u>	tification and prevention of bullying. Upon request, the department may	
13			prov	vide training and technical assistance to districts in carrying out this

15		<u>d.</u>	Eac	h local school board shall include the policy adopted by a school district	
16			purs	suant to this section in a publication of the comprehensive rules,	
17			prod	cedures, and standards of conduct for schools of a school district and in	
18			<u>eac</u>	h school's student's handbook.	
19		<u>e.</u>	<u>Info</u>	rmation regarding the school district's policy against bullying shall be	
20			inco	prporated into each district's professional development programs and shall	
21			be p	provided to volunteers and other noncertified employees of the district who	
22			hav	e significant contact with students.	
23		<u>f.</u>	<u>Sch</u>	ool districts shall implement kindergarten through grade twelve bullying	
24			<u>pre</u> v	vention programs. Upon request, the department of public instruction shall	
25			prov	vide guidance in developing these programs. Upon adoption of the	
26			prog	gram, but no later than June 13, 2013, each school district shall provide a	
27			repo	ort of the prevention program and its implementation to the department of	
28			pub	lic instruction.	
29	<u>4.</u>	This section may not be interpreted to prevent a victim from seeking redress			
30		pursuant to any other applicable civil or criminal law. This section does not create			
31		or a	alter a	iny civil cause of action for monetary damages against any person or

1	school district nor does it constitute grounds for any claim or motion raised by
2	either the state or defendant in any proceedings. A school employee, volunteer, or
3	student, or a student's parent or guardian who promptly, reasonably, and in good
4	faith reports an incident of bullying to the appropriate school official designated by
5	the school district or accredited nonpublic school is immune from civil or criminal
6	liability relating to such report and to participation in any administrative or judicial
7	proceeding resulting from or relating to the report.
