- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to creation of a lay and traditional midwife registry; to amend and
- 3 reenact sections 43-12.1-02, 43-12.1-09, and 43-12.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to the registry of lay and traditional midwives; to provide for a legislative management
- 5 study; and to provide an expiration date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-12.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 8 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 **43-12.1-02. Definitions.**
- 10 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 1. "Advanced practice registered nurse" means an individual who holds a current license
- to practice in this state as an advanced practice registered nurse.
- 13 2. "Board" means the North Dakota board of nursing.
- 14 3. "Lay or traditional midwife" means an individual who is currently registered as a lay or
- 15 <u>traditional midwife under this chapter.</u>
- 16 <u>4.</u> "Licensed practical nurse" means an individual who holds a current license to practice
- in this state as a licensed practical nurse.
- 18 4.5. "Nurse" means an individual who is currently licensed as an advanced practice
- registered nurse, registered nurse, or licensed practical nurse.
- 20 <u>5.6.</u> "Nursing" means the performance of acts utilizing specialized knowledge, skills, and
- abilities for people in a variety of settings. The term includes the following acts, which
- 22 may not be deemed to include acts of medical diagnosis or treatment or the practice of
- 23 medicine as defined in chapter 43-17:
- 24 a. The maintenance of health and prevention of illness.

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1 Diagnosing human responses to actual or potential health problems. b. 2 C. Providing supportive and restorative care and nursing treatment, medication 3 administration, health counseling and teaching, case finding and referral of 4 individuals who are ill, injured, or experiencing changes in the normal health 5 processes. 6 d. Administration, teaching, supervision, delegation, and evaluation of health and 7 nursing practices. 8 Collaboration with other health care professionals in the implementation of the e. 9 total health care regimen and execution of the health care regimen prescribed by 10 a health care practitioner licensed under the laws of this state. 11 6.7. "Prescriptive practices" means assessing the need for drugs, immunizing agents, or 12 devices and writing a prescription to be filled by a licensed pharmacist. 13 7.8. "Registered nurse" means an individual who holds a current license to practice in this 14 state as a registered nurse. 15 8.9. "Specialty practice registered nurse" means an individual who holds a current license 16 to practice in this state as a specialty practice registered nurse. 17 9.10. "Unlicensed assistive person" means an assistant to the nurse who regardless of title 18 is authorized by the board to perform nursing interventions delegated and supervised 19 by a nurse. 20 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows: 22 43-12.1-09. Initial licensure and registration. 23 The board shall license and register nursing, lay or traditional midwife, and unlicensed 24 assistive person applicants. The board shall adopt rules establishing qualifications for 25 initial nursing licensure and unlicensed assistive person registration and for issuing 26 limited licenses and registrations pursuant to subsection 3. 27 2. Each applicant who successfully meets the requirements of this section is entitled to 28 initial licensure or registration as follows: 29 An applicant for licensure by examination to practice as a registered nurse or a.

licensed practical nurse shall:

1 (1) Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the 2 board. 3 (2) Submit an official transcript showing completion of an in-state nursing 4 education program or a board-approved out-of-state nursing education 5 program preparing for the level of licensure sought. The board shall adopt 6 rules establishing standards for the approval of out-of-state nursing 7 education programs. These standards for out-of-state programs must 8 include consideration of whether the program is accredited by the national 9 league for nursing accrediting commission, incorporated, or the commission 10 on collegiate nursing education and whether the program meets the 11 requirements of the state in which the program is provided. 12 (3) Pass an examination approved by the board. 13 An applicant for licensure by endorsement to practice as a registered nurse or b. 14 licensed practical nurse shall: 15 Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the 16 board. 17 (2) Submit an official transcript showing completion of a nursing education 18 program preparing for the level of licensure sought. 19 (3) Submit proof of initial licensure by examination with the examination 20 meeting North Dakota requirements for licensure examinations in effect at 21 the time the applicant qualified for initial licensure. 22 Submit evidence of current unencumbered licensure in another state or (4) 23 meet continued competency requirements as established by the board. 24 (5) Notwithstanding the foregoing requirements of this subdivision, if an 25 applicant for licensure as a licensed practical nurse has been licensed in 26 another state as a licensed practical nurse based upon completion of a 27 registered nurse education program and has had at least twenty-four 28 months of unencumbered practice as a licensed practical nurse in another 29 state within the five-year period preceding the application, then the applicant 30 is not required to meet any additional educational requirements for licensure 31 as a licensed practical nurse.

26		(1)	Submit a completed application and appropriate fee as established by the

28		(2)	Submit evidence of appropriate education and current certification in a	
29			specialty nursing role by a national nursing organization meeting criteria as	
30			established by the board. A specialty practice registered nurse applicant

15	43-12.1-09.1. Nursing licensure Licensure or registration - Criminal history record					
16	checks					
17	The board may require each applicant for initial or renewed nursing licensure or registration					
18	and any licensee or registrant who is the subject of a disciplinary investigation or proceeding to					
19	submit to a statewide and nationwide criminal history record check. The nationwide criminal					
20	history record check must be conducted in the manner provided by section 12-60-24. All costs					
21	associated with obtaining a background check are the responsibility of the applicant, licensee,					
22	or registrant. The board may grant a nonrenewable temporary permit to an applicant for initial o					
23	renewed license or registration who submits to a criminal history record check as required by					
24	this chapter if the applicant has met all other licensure or registration requirements in					
25	accordance with subsection 2 of section 43-12.1-09.					
26	SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 43-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created					
27	and enacted as follows:					
28	Lay or traditional midwife registry.					
29	The board shall administer a voluntary registry for an individual who provides services to					
30	women and their newborn children outside of a hospital or clinical setting which is consistent

LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - REGULATION OF LAY OR 4 **TRADITIONAL MIDWIVES.** During the 2011-12 interim, the legislative management shall study 5 the feasibility and desirability of developing a mechanism for mandatory regulation of lay or 6 traditional midwives. The state department of health shall convene a task force of interested 7 parties to study the feasibility and desirability of developing a method and source of funding for 8 the regulation of lay or traditional midwives, including the gathering of current and relevant data, 9 and shall report any recommendations to the legislative management. The legislative 10 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation 11 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-third legislative assembly.

SECTION 6. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through July 31, 2013, and after that
