- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 8 of section 39-24-01, subsection 2 of
- 2 section 39-29-01, and subsection 1 of section 39-29-09 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to off-highway vehicles and snowmobiles.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 8 of section 39-24-01 of the North Dakota Century

- 6 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 8. "Snowmobile" means a self-propelled vehicle designed for travel on snow, ice, or a-
- 8 natural terrain and steered by skis or runnersintended for off-road travel primarily on
- 9 snow, having a curb weight of not more than one thousand seven hundred fifty pounds
- 10 [793.78 kilograms], driven by track or tracks in contact with the snow, steered by a ski
- 11 or skis in contact with the snow, and which is not wider than forty-eight inches
- 12 [121.92 centimeters]. The term does not include an off-highway vehicle as defined in
- 13 <u>chapter 39-29 converted to operate on tracks</u>.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 39-29-01 of the North Dakota Century
 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- "Off-highway vehicle" means any wheeled motorized vehicle not designed for use on a
 highway and capable of cross-country travel on land, snow, ice, marsh, swampland, or
 other natural terrain. An off-highway vehicle must be classified into one of the following
 categories:
- a. Class I off-highway vehicle is a vehicle that does not qualify as road capable
 under chapters 39-21 and 39-27, has a seat or a saddle designed to be straddled
 by the operator, and has handlebars for steering control of two wheels.
- b. Class II off-highway vehicle is less than fifty inches [1270.00 millimeters] or less
 in width, weighs one thousand two hundred pounds [544.31 kilograms] or less,

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1		and travels on three or more low-pressurenonhighway tires, has a saddle-
2		designed to be straddled by the operator, and has handlebars for steering
3		control; or is sixty-five inches [1651 millimeters] or less in width, weighs two
4		thousand pounds [907.19 kilograms] or less, and travels on four or more
5		nonhighway tires.
6	C.	Class III off-highway vehicle weighs less than eight thousand pounds,-
7		[3628.74 kilograms]; travels on skis, runners, tracks, or four or more tires;; has a
8		seat and; has a wheel, handlebars, or t steering for steering control ,; and is
9		designated for or capable of cross-country on or over land, water, sand, snow,
10		ice, marsh, swampland, or other natural terrain, unlessbut does not include a
11		vehicle registered by the department under chapter 39-04 or 39-24.
12	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-29-09 of the North Dakota Century	
13	Code is amended and reenacted as follows:	
14	1. An	individual may not operate an off-highway vehicle on the roadway, shoulder, or
15	ins	ide bank or slope of any road, street, or highway except as provided in this chapter.
16	Ex	cept in emergencies, an individual may not operate an off-highway vehicle within
17	the right of way of any controlled-access highway. An individual may operate a	
18	registered off-highway vehicle on a gravel, dirt, or loose surface roadway. An individual	
19	may operate a registered off-highway vehicle on a paved highway designated and	
20	posted at a speed not exceeding fifty-five miles [88.51 kilometers] per hour. A licensed	
21	driver over sixteen years of age may operate a registered class III off-highway vehicle	
22	on a paved highway designated and posted at a speed not exceeding sixty-five miles	
23	[104.61 kilometers] per hour. An individual may not operate an off-highway vehicle on	
24	<u>a p</u>	paved highway if the vehicle is unable to attain a speed, on a paved level surface, of
25	at	least thirty miles [48.28 kilometers] per hour.
