- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the establishment of an autism spectrum disorder database and
- 2 an autism spectrum disorder voucher program; to provide for a department of human services
- 3 study and report to the legislative management; and to provide an appropriation; and to provide
- 4 an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1.

7 <u>Autism spectrum disorder database - Rulemaking - Confidentiality.</u>

- 8 <u>1.</u> <u>The state department of health shall establish and administer an autism spectrum</u>
- 9 disorder database. The database must include a record of all reported cases of autism
- 10 <u>spectrum disorder in the state and any other information determined relevant and</u>
- 11 <u>appropriate by the department in order to complete epidemiologic surveys of the</u>
- 12 <u>autism spectrum disorder, enable research and analysis of the autism spectrum</u>
- 13 <u>disorder, and provide services to individuals with an autism spectrum disorder.</u>
- 14 <u>2.</u> <u>The state department of health shall establish criteria regarding who is qualified to</u>
- 15 report a case of autism spectrum disorder to the database. In establishing this criteria,
- 16 the department shall require that the reporter be a doctoral-level professional and be
- 17 <u>appropriately licensed, credentialed, and experienced in the field of autism spectrum</u>
- 18 disorder, including intellectual testing and other formal evidenced-based assessments
- 19 for autism spectrum disorders. The department shall consult with experts in
- 20 <u>establishing this criteria.</u>
- 21 <u>3.</u> <u>The database established under this section must:</u>
- a. Include the reported individual's diagnoses under the American psychiatric
 association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition;

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1		<u>b.</u>	Include a complete physical evaluation of the reported individual, performed by a	
2			licensed physician.	
3	<u>4.</u>	The state health council shall adopt rules to provide for mandatory reporting to the		
4		autism spectrum disorder database and to establish reporting requirements, including		
5		timeliness requirements.		
6	<u>5.</u>	<u>The</u>	e state department of health shall keep confidential all records of the database	
7		whi	ch could be used to identify a reported individual; however, the department may	
8		provide these records to other state agencies as necessary to effect the purposes of		
9		<u>this</u>	database without regard to the confidential nature of the records. If the	
10		<u>dep</u>	partment provides confidential records of the database to a state agency, the	
11		<u>dep</u>	partment shall notify the receiving agency of the confidential nature of the records	
12	1	and	the receiving agency shall treat these records as confidential.

14	<u>Aut</u>	Autism spectrum disorder voucher program - Appeal.		
15	<u> <u> </u></u>	- <u>The</u>	e department of human services shall establish a voucher program to assist in	
16		<u>fun</u>	ding equipment and general educational needs related to autism spectrum disorder	
17		for	individuals under age twenty-two who have been diagnosed with autism spectrum	
18		<u>dise</u>	order. The program may include funding for assistive technology; video modeling	
19		<u>vide</u>	eos or equipment; language-generating devices; training and educational material	
20		for	parents; parenting education; sensory equipment; tutors; safety equipment; travel	
21		tool	ls; self-care equipment; timers; visual representation systems; language	
22		<u>con</u>	nprehension equipment; and registration and related expenses for workshops and	
23		<u>trai</u>	ning to improve independent living skills, employment opportunities, and other	
24		<u>exe</u>	ecutive or social skills. In determining the amount of a voucher for which an	
25		<u>app</u>	licant may be determined eligible under this section, the department shall consider	
26		the	applicant's level of functioning.	
27	<u> <u>2. </u></u>	- <u>The</u>	e department shall adopt rules addressing management of this voucher program	
28		and	l establishing the eligibility requirements and exclusions for this voucher program.	
29		<u>The</u>	e program may not provide a voucher for early intensive behavioral intervention,	
30		incl	uding applied behavioral analysis, intensive early interventional behavioral therapy,	
31		inte	ensive behavioral intervention, the Lovaas method, the Denver model, LEAP	

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1	(learning experiences - an alternative program for preschoolers and parents),		
2	TEACCH (treatment and education of autistic and related communication handicapped		
3	children), pivotal response training, or discrete trial training.		
4	<u>3.</u> <u>A decision on a voucher application which is issued by the department under this</u>		
5	section may be appealed as provided under chapter 28-32.		
6	SECTION 2. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER		
7	MEDICAID WAIVER. The department of human services, by January 1, 2014, shall seek		
8	approval from the federal centers for medicare and medicaid services to expand the		
9	department's autism spectrum disorder medicaid waiver to cover twenty additional individuals		
10	from birth through age thirteen and to provide appropriate behavior intervention and treatment		
11	services that may include evidence-based and promising practices, case management services,		
12	technology and technology-based support, in-home support, equipment and supplies, home		
13	monitoring, respite care, residential supports and services, and behavioral consultation.		
14	SECTION 3. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - AUTISM SPECTRUM		
15	DISORDER EDUCATIONAL TRAINING AND SUPPORT. The department of public instruction		
16	shall provide training and support to general education classroom teachers and other school		
17	staff regarding the most effective methods of educating and providing services and support to		
18	individuals with autism spectrum disorder.		
19	SECTION 4. DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER		
20	STUDY AND REPORT TO THE LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. During the 2013-14 interim, in		
21	consultation with clinicians who have expertise in the evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment of		
22	autism spectrum disorder, the department of human services shall study autism spectrum		
23	disorder services, including the most feasible service delivery system for individuals not served		
24	in the developmental disability system who have an autism spectrum disorder. Before August 1,		
25	2014, the department of human services shall report to the legislative management the		
26	outcome and recommendations of this study.		
27	SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH - AUTISM		
28	SPECTRUM DISORDER DATABASE. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general		
29	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$200,648\$148,132, or so		
30	much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of

31 establishing and administering an autism spectrum disorder database, for the biennium

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- 1 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. The state department of health is authorized
- 2 one full-time equivalent position for this purpose.

3 **SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - STATE** 4 AUTISM COORDINATOR. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the 5 state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$400,000\$265,136, or so much of the 6 sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of hiring a state 7 autism coordinator who would be responsible for implementing a resource and service center to 8 provide information and services for individuals with autism spectrum disorder, developing a 9 statewide outreach plan, conducting regional meetings and an annual conference, and 10 developing a protocol for use after screenings, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and 11 ending June 30, 2015. The department of human services is authorized one full-time equivalent 12 position for this purpose. 13 **SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - STATEWIDE** 14 AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER TRAINING EFFORT. There is appropriated out of any 15 moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of 16 \$500,000\$250,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human 17 services for the purpose of implementing a statewide autism spectrum disorder training effort, 18 including physician training, regional training, school staff training, and parent training, for the 19 biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 20 SECTION 8. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through June 30, 2015, and after that 21 date is ineffective.
