- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 12.1-23-16 and a new subsection to section
- 2 57-39.2-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the prohibition of automated sales
- 3 suppression devices; and to provide a penalty.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 12.1-23-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>12.1-23-16. Automated sales suppression device, zapper, or phantom-ware -</u>
- 8 Prohibition Penalties.
- 9 1. For purposes of this section:
- a. "Automated sales suppression device" or "zapper" means a software program
  carried on a memory stick or removable compact disc, accessed through an
  internet link, or accessed through any other method, which falsifies the electronic
  records, transaction data, or transaction reports of electronic cash registers and
- 14 <u>other point-of-sale systems.</u>
- b. "Electronic cash register" means a device that keeps a register or supporting
  documents through the use of an electronic device or computer system designed
  to record transaction data for the purpose of computing, compiling, or processing
  retail sales transaction data or transaction reports.
- c. "Phantom-ware" means a hidden, preinstalled or installed at a later time,
  programming option embedded in the operating system of an electronic cash
  register or hardwired into the electronic cash register, which can be used to
  create a virtual second cash register or that can eliminate or manipulate
- 23 <u>transaction records that may be preserved in digital formats to represent the true</u>
- 24 <u>or manipulated transaction data or reports in the electronic cash register and is</u>

1 intended to falsify the electronic records of an electronic cash register or other 2 point-of-sale system. 3 <u>d.</u> "Transaction data" means items purchased by a customer, the price for each 4 item, a taxability determination for each item, a segregated tax amount for each 5 of the taxed items, the amount of cash or credit tendered, the net amount 6 returned to the customer in change, the date and time of purchase, the name, 7 address, and identification number of the vendor, and the receipt or invoice 8 number of the transaction. 9 "Transaction report" means a report documenting sales, the tax collected, <u>e.</u> 10 methods of payment, voided sales, or other information at an electronic cash 11 register which is printed on cash register tape at the end of a day or shift, or a 12 report documenting every transaction at an electronic cash register that is stored 13 electronically. 14 <u>2.</u> It is unlawful to willfully sell, purchase, possess, install, transfer, manufacture, own, or 15 use in this state, an automated sales suppression device, zapper, or phantom-ware. 16 Any person convicted of a violation under subsection 2 is guilty of a class B felony and <u>3.</u> 17 any person convicted of a second or subsequent violation of subsection 2 is quilty of a 18 class A felony. 19 <u>4.</u> It is a defense to prosecution under this section that the person purchased, 20 possessed, installed, transferred, owned, or used in this state, an automated sales 21 suppression device, zapper, or phantom-ware for a legitimate purpose. 22 Any person violating subsection 2 is liable for all sales and use tax, income tax, or 5. 23 other tax under title 57, and any county or city sales and use tax imposed under 24 sections 11-09.2-05 and 40-05.1-06, and associated penalties and interest due the 25 state as the result of the fraudulent use of an automated sales suppression device, 26 zapper, or phantom-ware. Any tax found to be due must be assessed at double the 27 amount so determined. 28 The person shall forfeit all proceeds associated with the sale or use of an automated 6. 29 sales suppression device, zapper, or phantom-ware. The proceeds forfeited under this 30 section must be deposited with the state treasurer for deposit in the state general fund.

1	<u>7.</u>	An automated sales suppression device, zapper, or phantom-ware, and the cash
2		register or other device containing the device or the software, is contraband and
3		subject to forfeiture in accordance with chapter 29-31.1.
4	SEC	<b>TION 2.</b> A new subsection to section 57-39.2-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	created a	and enacted as follows:
6		Whenever the holder of a permit is convicted of violating section 12.1-23-16, the
7		commissioner shall revoke the permit and the holder is not eligible to receive another
8		permit for a period of ten years from the date of revocation.
