1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 40-08-09 and section 40-09-17
2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to permitting a volunteer firefighter or ambulance
3 crew member receiving compensation from a city to serve as a member of the city council or
4 city commission.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 40-08-09 of the North Dakota Century
7 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

8 2. A member of the city council may serve as an ambulance ~~driver~~, crew member
9 employed by the city or under a contract with the city; and be remunerated for those
10 services or as a volunteer firefighter or ambulance crew member for the city and be
11 compensated for attending training or responding to fireemergency calls or may be
12 reimbursed for expenses incurred in attending training or in responding to
13 fireemergency calls.

14 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 40-09-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is
15 amended and reenacted as follows:

16 **40-09-17. Restrictions on members of board.**

18 1. Except as provided in subsection 2, a member of the board of city commissioners
19 ~~shall~~ may not:
20 ~~1. a.~~ Be eligible to any other office the salary of which is payable out of the city
21 treasury;
22 ~~2. b.~~ Hold any other office under the city government; and
23 ~~3. c.~~ Hold a position of remuneration in the employment of the city.

1 2. A member of a board of city commissioners may serve as an ambulance crew member
2 employed by the city or under a contract with the city and be remunerated for those
3 services or as a volunteer firefighter or ambulance crew member for the city and be
4 compensated for attending training or responding to emergency calls or may be
5 reimbursed for expenses incurred in attending training or in responding to emergency
6 calls.
