- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.4 and 15.1-21.-02.5 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to requirements for North Dakota scholarships; and to declare an
- 3 emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1 AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-21-02.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 8 Any resident student who graduates from a high school during or after the 2010-11 school
- 9 year is eligible to receive a North Dakota career and technical education scholarship provided
- 10 the student:

- 12 composition, and speech;
- 13 2. Completed three units of mathematics, including:
- a. One unit of algebra II, as defined by the superintendent of public instruction; and
- b. Two units of any other mathematics;

- 17 a. One unit of physical science;
- b. One unit of biology; and
- 19 c. (1) One unit of any other science; or
- 20 (2) Two one-half units of any other science;
- 4. Completed three units of social studies, including:
- a. One unit of United States history;
- b. (1) One-half unit of United States government and one-half unit of economics;
