BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 15.1-19-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- Any discussion of policy relating to allowing concealed weapons license holders to

 possess a firearm or dangerous weapon in a school may be held in executive session

 under the procedure in section 44-09-19.244-04-19.2.
 - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 62.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 13 **62.1-02-05.** Possession of a firearm at a public gathering Penalty Application.
 - 1. A personAn individual who possesses a firearm at a public gathering is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. For the purpose of this section, "public gathering" includes athletic or sporting events, schools or school functions, churches or church functions, political rallies or functions, musical concerts, and individuals in publicly owned parks where hunting is not allowed by proclamation and publicly owned or operated buildings. The term "public gathering" does not apply to a state or federal park.
- 20 2. This section does not apply to law:
 - a. A law enforcement officers officer; members
 - <u>b.</u> A member of the armed forces of the United States or national guard, organized reserves, state defense forces, or state guard organizations, when on duty;
 <u>competitors</u>

In addition, a: <u>h.</u> 9 <u>i.</u> A state or federal park; 10 An individual possessing a valid class 1 concealed weapons license from this j. 11 state or who has reciprocity under section 62.1-04-03.1 authorizing the 12 personindividual to carry a firearm concealed if the individual is in a school and 13 has the approval to carry under a policy adopted by the governing body of the 14 school. If a school authorizes an individual to carry a concealed weapon, local 15 law enforcement must be informed of the name of the authorized individual; and 16 A municipal court judge licensed to practice law in this state, a district court <u>k.</u> 17 judge, a staff member of the office of attorney general, and a retired North Dakota 18 law enforcement officer are exempt from the prohibition and penalty in-19 subsection 1, if the individual maintains the same level of firearms proficiency as 20 is required by the peace officer standards and training board for law enforcement 21 officers. A local law enforcement agency shall issue a certificate of compliance 22 under this section to an individual who is proficient. 23 3. This section does not prevent any political subdivision from enacting an ordinance 24 whichthat is less restrictive than this section relating to the possession of firearms at a 25 public gathering. Such anAn enacted ordinance supersedes this section within the 26 jurisdiction of the political subdivision.
