1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service

2 commission; to amend and reenact sections 49-01-05 and 64-02-10 of the North Dakota

3 Century Code, relating to the salary of public service commissioners and fees to test or

4 <u>calibrate weighing and measuring devices; to provide for a statement of legislative intent; to</u>

5 provide for a legislative management study; to authorize a transfer; and to declare an

6 emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 9 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 11 other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of 12 that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

26 The 2013-15 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the

27 2015-17 biennium. The public service commission shall report to the appropriations committees

28 of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium

beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

30 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is

31 amended and reenacted as follows:

Sixty-third Legislative Assembly

1	49-01-05. Salary of commissioners.		
2	The annual salary of a commissioner is ninety-twoninety-eightninety-nine thousand		
3	eightfour hundred twenty-sixseventy-ninethirty-five dollars through June 30, 20122014, and		
4	ninety-fiveone hundred onethree thousand sixfour hundred eleventhirty-threetwelve dollars		
5	thereafter. All fees received or charged by any commissioner for any act or service rendered in		
6	any official capacity must be accounted for and paid over by the commissioner monthly to the		
7	state treasurer and must be credited to the general fund of the state.		
8	SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY. The legislative management shall		
9	consider studying, during the 2013-14 interim, civil penalties assessed and collected by state		
10	agencies, including a review of the funds into which the collections are deposited and the		
11	appropriateness of the use of funds collected. The legislative management shall report its		
12	findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the		
13	recommendations, to the sixty-fourth legislative assembly.		
14	SECTION 5. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY HARDWARE - TRANSFER TO SECURE		
15	DATA CENTER. The public service commission shall transfer all appropriate information		
16	technology hardware to the information technology department secure data center during the		
17	biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.		
18	SECTION 5. TRANSFER AND REPAYMENT - BEGINNING FARMER REVOLVING LOAN		
19	FUND. The sum of \$900,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the		
20	estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act, shall be transferred by the Bank of North		
21	Dakota from the beginning farmer revolving loan fund to the public service commission to pay		
22	for costs associated with a rail rate complaint case. Transfers shall be made during the		
23	biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, upon order of the commission. If		
24	any amounts are spent pursuant to this section, the public service commission shall reimburse		
25	the beginning farmer revolving loan fund using amounts available from damages or proceeds		
26	received, net of legal fees, from a successful outcome of a rail complaint case.		
27	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 64-02-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
28	amended and reenacted as follows:		
29	64-02-10. Fees to test or calibrate weighing and measuring devices.

4	When a rejected weighing or measuring device has been reconditioned or replaced by new		
5	equipment, it must be retested and certified before being put into use except as otherwise		
6	provided by rule. The fee for retest and certification is the same as for the first test and		
7	certification.		
8	When a test of a weighing or measuring device is required in addition to the regularly		
9	scheduled test, the commission shall charge a fee equal to the cost of operating the motor		
10	vehicle used in conducting the test. The mileage charges, as determined by the commission,		
11	must be in addition to the regular test fee and calculated to cover the costs of the additional		
12	travel. If a test has been requested and the person requesting it fails to appear or to have the		
13	weighing or measuring device ready for testing at the arranged time, there is a charge of ten		
14	dollars a quarter hour for the time between the arranged time and the time at which the test can		
15	begin.		
16	SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - GAS PIPELINE SAFETY INSPECTOR AND		
17	PUBLIC UTILITY ANALYST. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the public service		
18	commission proceedsproceed in the hiring process of a gas pipeline safety inspector and public		
19	utility analyst position that hashave been repurposed in the commission's 2013-15 biennium		
20	budget from the weights and measures program prior to June 30, 2013.		
21	SECTION 8. EMERGENCY. This Section 7 of this Act is declared to be an emergency		
22	measure.
