1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the North Dakota 2 university system; to provide an appropriation to the state board of higher education for a-3 settlement payment for the termination of the contract of the commissioner of higher education-4 to provide contingent appropriations; to create and enact six new sections to chapter 15-10 of 5 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to provisions of matching grants for the advancement 6 of postsecondary academics; to amend and reenact sections 15-10-47, 15-52-01, 15-52-03, 7 <u>15-52-04, 15-52-05, 15-52-09, 15-52-31</u>, and 15-62.2-02, subsection 2 of section 15-70-04, and 8 section 54-44.1-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to construction project variance 9 reports, the state medical center, student financial assistance grants, tribally controlled 10 community college grants, and the cancellation of unexpended appropriations; to repeal section 11 section 5 of Senate Bill No. 2018, as approved by the sixty-third legislative assembly, relating to 12 a contingent appropriation; to provide an exemption; to provide for transfer of funds; to 13 authorize the state board of higher education to issue and sell bonds for capital projects; to 14 provide for budget section reports; to provide loan authorization for the university of North 15 Dakota school of medicine and health sciences facility project; to provide for legislative 16 management reports; to provide for a legislative management study; to provide an expiration 17 date; and to declare an emergency.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income to the North Dakota university system office and to the various entities and institutions under the supervision of the state board of higher education for the purpose of

- 1 defraying the expenses of the North Dakota university system office and to the various entities
- 2 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

2	CONTRACT TERMINATION - LIMITATION - APPLICATION. There is appropriated out of any
3	moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of
4	\$854,520, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state board of higher education
5	for the purpose of providing a settlement payment for the termination of the contract of the
6	commissioner of higher education, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act
7	and ending June 30, 2015. The funding provided under this section may be used only for a
8	settlement payment and is available to the state board of higher education upon the termination-
9	of the contract that was in effect on January 1, 2013, for the commissioner of higher education
10	For purposes of this section and the contract of the commissioner of higher education,
11	"chancellor of the North Dakota university system" means the commissioner of higher education
12	as provided for under section 6 of article VIII of the Constitution of North Dakota. The office of
13	management and budget shall reduce the available appropriation provided under this section by

Up to 10 \$600,000 of the general fund appropriation for the project may be used to develop programming 11 at the communications and creative arts center that includes written and spoken 12 communications, visual and performing arts, social sciences, history, law, economics, 13 philosophy, and current events. Funding may be used for items including curriculum 14 development, student activities, faculty enhancement, public programming, and the 15 development and publication of appropriate media to promote these activities. 16 SECTION 27. UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH 17 SCIENCES BISMARCK FAMILY PRACTICE CENTER SKYWALK PROJECT. The capital 18 assets line item in subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$750,000 from the 19 general fund for the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences 20 Bismarck family practice center skywalk project. The university of North Dakota shall provide 21 \$1 of nonstate funding for the project for every \$1 of funding used from the general fund 22 appropriation. 23 SECTION 28. UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH 24 SCIENCES FACILITY PROJECT - LOAN AUTHORIZATION. The legislative assembly 25 authorizes the construction of the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health 26 sciences facility project to be funded in two phases as provided under this section. The capital 27 assets line item in subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$60,450,000, or so 28 much of the sum as may be necessary, for phase 1 of the project. The university of North 29 Dakota may also seek funding from the capital projects contingency pool in accordance with 30 section 24 of this Act for costs associated with phase 1 of the project. During the biennium 31 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, and continuing into the biennium beginning

1	July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, the state board of higher education may borrow the
2	sum of \$62,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the Bank of North
3	Dakota for completion of phase 2 of the school of medicine and health sciences facility project.

14	flood, including capital, as determined by the university.
15	SECTION 31. NORTH DAKOTA STATE UNIVERSITY - MINARD HALL - BUDGET
16	SECTION REPORT. North Dakota state university may use unspent funding from the
17	\$5,000,000 appropriation received during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending
18	June 30, 2009, and unspent funding from the \$13,000,000 appropriation received during the
19	biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011, for the Minard hall project, for the
20	biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. North Dakota state university shall
21	report to the budget section regarding the status of the Minard hall project and may request
22	increased spending authorization from the budget section for the project.
23	SECTION 32. STUDENT LOAN TRUST FUND. Subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act
24	includes the sum of \$1,004,744, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the student
25	loan trust fund of which \$465,307 is for the professional student exchange program and
26	\$539,437 is for connectND campus solution positions, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013,
27	and ending June 30, 2015.
28	SECTION 33. UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH
29	SCIENCES OPERATIONS. The operations line item in subdivision 5 of section 1 of this Act
30	includes the sum of \$158,904,848, whicha funding allocation from the higher education per

2013, and ending June 30, 2015. A minimum of twenty-five percent of the allocation must be
 transferred, in part, by the state board of higher education, based on the recommendation of the
 commissioner of higher education, to the university of North Dakota school of medicine and
 health sciences for operations consistent with the higher education per student credit-hour
 funding formulabased on the recommendation of the commissioner of higher education.
 SECTION 34. FEDERAL, PRIVATE, AND OTHER FUNDS - APPROPRIATION. All funds,
 in addition to those appropriated in section 1 of this Act, from federal, private, and other sources

for competitive grants or other funds that the legislative assembly has not indicated the intent to reject, including tuition revenue, received by the institutions and entities under the control of the state board of higher education are appropriated to those institutions and entities, for the biennium beginning July 1,2013, and ending June 30, 2015. All additional funds received under the North Dakota-Minnesota reciprocity agreement during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, are appropriated to the state board of higher education for reimbursement to institutions under the control of the board.

SECTION 35. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. If, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, the state board of higher education determines that funds allocated to operations in section 1 of this Act are needed for capital assets, the board may transfer funds from operations to capital assets. The board shall report any transfer of funds under this section to the office of management and budget.

SECTION 36. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITION ADJUSTMENTS. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the state board of higher education may adjust full-time equivalent positions as needed, subject to the availability of funds, for institutions and entities under its control during the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. The North Dakota university system shall report any adjustments to the office of management and budget before the submission of the 2015-17 biennium budget request.

SECTION 37. BOND ISSUANCE AUTHORIZATION - PURPOSES. The state board of higher education, in accordance with chapter 15-55, may arrange for the funding of projects authorized in this section, declared to be in the public interest, through the issuance of self-liquidating, tax-exempt evidences of indebtedness under chapter 15-55, beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2015. Evidences of indebtedness issued pursuant to this section are not a general obligation of the state of North Dakota. Any unexpended

- 1 balance resulting from the proceeds of the evidences of indebtedness must be placed in a
- 2 sinking fund to be used for the retirement of indebtedness. The evidences of indebtedness may
- 3 be issued and the proceeds are appropriated in section 1 of this Act for the following capital
- 4 projects:

9 SECTION 38. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT REPORT - POSTSECONDARY ACADEMIC

MATCHING GRANTS. Before October 1, 2014, the state board of higher education shall
provide a report to the legislative management regarding the number of matching grants that
were sought, the number that were awarded, and the manner in which the grants were used as
provided in sections 5 through 10 of this Act.

14 SECTION 39. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - STATE AGENCY LEGAL

15 SERVICES. During the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying 16 legal services provided by attorneys in executive branch state agencies. The study, if 17 conducted, must review the services provided by attorneys in each agency, supervision of the 18 attorneys in each agency, and whether the attorneys are classified as assistant or special 19 assistant attorneys general. The study must also review the use of contracted legal services by 20 each agency. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, 21 together with any legislation needed to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fourth 22 legislative assembly.

23 SECTION 40. EXPIRATION DATE. Sections 5 through 10 of this Act are effective through
24 June 30, 2015, and after that date are ineffective.

25 SECTION 41. EMERGENCY. Sections 3 and 1821, 23, 27, 28, 29, 30, and 37 of this Act;

- 26 \$200,000 included in the operations line item in subdivision 8 of section 1 of this Act for the
- 27 Theodore Roosevelt center; \$5,000,000 included in the operations line item in subdivision 10 of
- 28 section 1 of this Act for flood recovery funding; and the capital assets, master plan and space
- 29 <u>utilization study</u>, and deferred maintenance pool line items contained in section 1 of this Act are
- 30 declared to be an emergency measure.
