1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 39-06.1-06 and section
2 39-08-20 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the offense of driving without liability
3 insurance.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 39-06.1-06 of the North Dakota
6 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 2. For a moving violation as defined in section 39-06.1-09, a fee of twenty dollars, except
8 for:

- 9 a. A violation of section 39-10-26, 39-10-26.2, 39-10-41, or 39-10-42, a fee of fifty
10 dollars.
- 11 b. A violation of section 39-10-05 involving failure to yield to a pedestrian or
12 subsection 1 of section 39-10-28, a fee of fifty dollars.
- 13 c. A violation of section 39-21-41.2, a fee of twenty-five dollars.
- 14 d. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-12-02 or section 39-08-23, a fee of one
15 hundred dollars.
- 16 e. A violation of subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 39-12-04, a fee of one
17 hundred dollars.
- 18 f. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-04-37 by an individual by becoming a
19 resident of this state, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- 20 g. A violation of subsection 2 of section 39-10-21.1, a fee of two hundred fifty
21 dollars.
- 22 h. A violation of section 39-10-59, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- 23 i. A violation of section 39-09-01, a fee of thirty dollars.
- 24 j. A violation of section 39-09-01.1, a fee of thirty dollars.

- 1 k. A violation of section 39-10-46 or 39-10-46.1, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- 2 l. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-08-20, one hundred fifty dollars for a first
- 3 violation and three hundred dollars for a second or subsequent violation in three
- 4 years.

5 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-08-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **39-08-20. Driving without liability insurance prohibited - Penalty.**

- 8 1. A person may not drive, or the owner may not cause or knowingly permit to be driven,
- 9 a motor vehicle in this state without a valid policy of liability insurance in effect in order
- 10 to respond in damages for liability arising out of the ownership, maintenance, or use of
- 11 that motor vehicle in the amount required by chapter 39-16.1.
- 12 2. Upon being stopped by a law enforcement officer for the purpose of enforcing or
- 13 investigating the possible violation of an ordinance or state law, the person driving the
- 14 motor vehicle shall provide to the officer upon request satisfactory evidence, including
- 15 written or electronic proof of insurance, of the policy required under this section. If
- 16 unable to comply with the request, that person may be charged with a violation of this
- 17 section. If that person produces satisfactory evidence, including written or electronic
- 18 proof of insurance, of a valid policy of liability insurance in effect at the time of the
- 19 alleged violation of this section to the office of the court under which the matter will be
- 20 heard, that person may not be ~~convicted or assessed any administration fee for~~found
- 21 in violation of subsection 1.
- 22 3. Notwithstanding section 26.1-30-18, a person may be ~~convicted~~in violation of
- 23 subsection 1 for failure to have a valid policy of liability insurance in effect under this
- 24 section if the time of acquisition of the policy was after the time of the alleged
- 25 incidence of driving without liability insurance. If the time of acquisition of the policy
- 26 comes into question, the driver or owner has the burden of establishing the time of
- 27 acquisition. If the driver is not an owner of the motor vehicle, the driver does not
- 28 violate this section if the driver provides the court with evidence identifying the owner
- 29 of the motor vehicle and describing circumstances under which the owner caused or
- 30 permitted the driver to drive the motor vehicle.

- 1 4. ~~Violation of subsection 1 is an infraction and the sentence imposed must include a fine-~~
2 ~~of at least one hundred fifty dollars which may not be suspended. A person convicted-~~
3 ~~for a second or subsequent violation of driving without liability insurance within a-~~
4 ~~three-year period must be fined at least three hundred dollars which may not be-~~
5 ~~suspended.~~ For a second or subsequent ~~conviction for a~~ violation of subsection 1 or
6 equivalent ordinance, the court shall order the motor vehicle number plates of the
7 motor vehicle owned and operated by the person at the time of the violation to be
8 impounded until that person provides proof of insurance and a twenty dollar fee to the
9 court. The person shall deliver the number plates to the court without delay at a time
10 certain as ordered by the court ~~following the conviction.~~ The court shall deliver the
11 number plates to the office of the police officer that made the arrest and notify the
12 department of the order. A person who does not provide the number plates to the court
13 at the appropriate time is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.
- 14 5. ~~Upon conviction for~~For a violation of subsection 1 or equivalent ordinance, the person
15 ~~who has been convicted~~ shall provide proof of motor vehicle liability insurance to the
16 department in the form of a written or electronically transmitted certificate from an
17 insurance carrier authorized to do business in this state. This proof must be provided
18 for a period of three years and kept on file with the department. If the person fails to
19 provide this information, the department shall suspend that person's driving privileges
20 and may not issue or renew that person's operator's license unless that person
21 provides proof of insurance.
- 22 6. A person who has ~~been convicted for violation of~~violated subsection 1 or equivalent
23 ordinance shall surrender that person's operator's license and purchase a duplicate
24 operator's license with a notation requiring that person to keep proof of liability
25 insurance on file with the department. The fee for this license is fifty dollars and the fee
26 to remove this notation is fifty dollars.
- 27 7. When an insurance carrier has certified a motor vehicle liability policy, the insurance
28 carrier shall notify the director no later than ten days after cancellation or termination
29 of the certified insurance policy by filing a notice of cancellation or termination of the
30 certified insurance policy; except that a policy subsequently procured and certified

- 1 shall, on the effective date of its certification, terminate the insurance previously
- 2 certified with respect to any motor vehicle designated in both certificates.
