- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 54-35-15.2, subsection 8 of section 54-59-05,
- 2 and section 54-59-23 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of a large
- 3 information technology project.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-15.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is

- 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 54-35-15.2. Information technology committee Powers and duties.

8 The information technology committee has continuing existence and may meet and conduct

- 9 its business during the legislative session and in the interim between sessions. The committee
- 10 shall:
- 11 1. Meet at least once each calendar quarter.
- 12 2. Receive a report from the chief information officer of the state at each meeting.
- 13 3. Review the business plan of the information technology department.
- 14 4. Review macro-level issues relating to information technology.
- 15 5. Review the activities of the information technology department.
- 16 6. Review statewide information technology standards.
- 17 7. Review the statewide information technology plan.
- 18 8. Review information technology efficiency and security.
- Review established or proposed information technology programs and information
 technology acquisition by the executive and judicial branches.
- Except as provided in subsection 11, receive and review information, including a
 project startup report summarizing the project description, project objectives, business
- 23 need or problem, cost-benefit analysis, and project risks and a project closeout report
- 24 summarizing the project objectives achieved, project budget and schedule variances,

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- and lessons learned, from the information technology department and the affected
 agency regarding any major information technology project of an executive branch
 agency. For the purposes of this subsection, a major project is a project with a total
 cost of twofive hundred fifty thousand dollars or more.
- 5 11. Receive and review information, including a project startup report summarizing a. 6 the project description, project objectives, business need or problem, cost-benefit 7 analysis, and project risks and a project closeout report summarizing the project 8 objectives achieved, project budget and schedule variances, and lessons 9 learned, from the information technology department and the affected institution 10 regarding any major project of the state board of higher education or any 11 institution under the control of the state board of higher education if the project:
 - Significantly impacts the statewide wide area network, including the campus access routers;
 - (2) Impacts the statewide library system; or
- 15 (3) Is an administrative project. An administrative project is a project that
 16 directly collects, aggregates, modifies, stores, or reports institutional
 17 student, financial, or human resources records or data and is provided
 18 primarily for administrative purposes.
- b. For the purposes of this subsection, a major project is a project with a cost of two hundred fifty thousand dollars or more in one biennium or a total cost of five
 hundred thousand dollars or more.
- Receive and review information from the information technology department and the
 affected agency regarding any information technology project of an executive branch
 agency with a total cost of between one hundred thousand and twofive hundred fifty thousand dollars as determined necessary by the information technology department.
- Receive a report from the chief information officer regarding the recommendations of
 the state information technology advisory committee relating to the prioritization of
 proposed major information technology projects and other information technology
 issues.
- Receive and review information, including a project startup report summarizing the
 project description, project objectives, business need or problem, cost-benefit

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1		analysis, and project risks and a project closeout report summarizing the project
2		objectives achieved, project budget and schedule variances, and lessons learned,
3		from the affected legislative or judicial branch agency regarding any information
4		technology project of the legislative or judicial branch with a total cost of twofive
5		hundred fifty thousand dollars or more.
6	15.	Receive information from the state board of higher education regarding higher
7		education information technology planning, services, and major projects.
8	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 8 of section 54-59-05 of the North Dakota Century
9	Code is	amended and reenacted as follows:
10	8.	May request and review information regarding any information technology project of
11		an executive branch agency with a total cost of between one hundred thousand and
12		twofive hundred fifty thousand dollars as determined necessary by the department.
13		The department shall present the information to the information technology committee
14		on request of the committee.
15	SEC	TION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 54-59-23 of the North Dakota Century Code is
16	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
17	54-5	9-23. Information technology projects - Reports.
18	1.	An executive, legislative, or judicial branch agency, except for institutions under the
19		control of the state board of higher education, shall report to the state information
20		technology advisory committee according to guidelines developed by the department
21		and reviewed by the state information technology advisory committee regarding the
22		plan for and status of any information technology project that is estimated to cost more
23		than two<u>five</u> hundred fifty thousand dollars.
24	2.	During the life of the project, the agency shall notify the state information technology
25		advisory committee if:
26		a. At a project milestone, the amount expended on project costs exceeds the
27		planned budget for that milestone by twenty percent or more; or
28		b. At a project milestone, the project schedule extends beyond the planned
29		schedule to attain that milestone by twenty percent or more.
30	3.	A report under subsection 2 must specify corrective measures being undertaken to
31		address any cost or time of completion issue. If the agency has not taken adequate

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- corrective measures within ninety days after the report, the agency shall submit a
 report to the legislative management's information technology committee regarding the
 project.
 Upon completion of the project, the agency shall notify the state information
 technology advisory committee if:
- 6a.The budget for the project exceeded the original budget by twenty percent or7more; or
- 8 b. The final project completion date extended beyond the original project scheduled
 9 completion date by twenty percent or more.
