- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota-
- 2 Century Code, relating to the provision of North Dakota scholarships to students who receive-
- 3 home education; and to amend and reenact section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century
- 4 Code, relating to the provision of North Dakota scholarships to students who receive home-
- 5 education. for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.4, 15.1-21-02.5, and
- 6 <u>15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the provision of North Dakota</u>
- 7 scholarships to students who receive home education; to provide for a transfer; to provide an
- 8 appropriation; and to declare an emergency.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

22	the gran	its - s	state s	school aid line item after superintendent of public instruction complies with all			
23	statutory	y pay	ment	obligations imposed for the 2011-13 biennium, the superintendent shall			
24	transfer	the fi	irst \$2	250,000 to the home education scholarship fund in the state treasury. Moneys			
25	in the home education scholarship fund are not subject to section 54-44.1-11.						
26	SEC		N 5. A	PPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the home			
27	educatio	on scl	holars	ship fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of			
28	\$250,00	0, or	so m	uch of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public			
29	instructi	on fo	r the p	purpose of providing scholarships to home-educated students in accordance			
30	with sections 1 through 3 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending						
31	June 30, 2015.						

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SECTION 6. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
