- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 61-16.2-05 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to flood plain management ordinances; and to amend and
- 3 reenact section 61-16.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to exceptions to flood
- 4 plain management actions or construction.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 61-16.2-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 3. Construction of water retention structures must be approved by sixty percent of
 property owners within the geographic water retention area affected by the manmade
 structure.
- 11 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 61-16.2-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 13 **61-16.2-10. Exceptions.**
- This chapter shalldoes not apply to the following actions or construction, as long asprovided
 the flood-carrying capacity within the altered or relocated portion of anya watercourse is
 maintained, and the cumulative effect of any suchthe action or construction willdoes not
 increase the water surface elevation of the base flood more than one foot [30.48 centimeters] at
 any point:
 - Ring dikes around individual farmsteads which are not constructed with tiebacks to
 existing roadways or dikes. For the purposes of this section, "ring dike" means an
 embankment constructed of earth or other suitable materials for purposes of enclosing
 a farmstead consisting of a farm dwelling and associated farm buildings.
 - Agricultural dikes along the Red River of the North and Bois de Sioux River which are constructed pursuant to and in accordance with anya joint and cooperative

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1	agreements agreement between North Dakota and Minnesota for the establishment of
2	criteria for authorizing dikes and other flood control structures and measures on the
3	Red River of the North and Bois de Sioux River.
4	AnyAn exception to the national flood insurance program [42 U.S.C. 4001 et seq.] and
5	implementing regulations granted by the appropriate federal agency to a community which is
6	participating in the national flood insurance program [42 U.S.C. 4001 et seq.] shallmust be an
7	approved exception pursuant to this section, provided the exception is not in conflict with
8	existing state law.
