- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 37-17.1-06 and a new
- 2 subdivision to subsection 1 of section 37-17.1-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 3 to emergency response to hazardous materials incidents.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 37-17.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 created and enacted as follows: 7 The division of homeland security shall serve as a central information dissemination 8 point and repository for initial notification information for spills and discharges in the 9 state for hazardous materials as defined in section 37-17.1-07.1. The division shall 10 develop processes to ensure proper state and federal agencies that have oversight 11 responsibilities are promptly notified. The division shall also provide notice to local 12 emergency management officials within a time that is consistent with the level of 13 emergency. 14 SECTION 2. A new subdivision to subsection 1 of section 37-17.1-07.1 the North Dakota 15 Century Code is created and enacted as follows: 16 For purposes of monitoring, determining if emergency response may be required. 17 and notifying local officials, owners and operators or responsible parties shall 18 report all spills or discharges to the appropriate state agency. The report must 19 include the name of the reporting party, including phone number and address; 20 date; time of release; location of release; containment status; waterways 21 involved; and immediate potential threat. If the release occurs or travels off site 22 from a facility, the owner and operator or responsible party shall notify the surface 23 owner within a reasonable time. State agencies that receive direct reports of

spills or discharges shall provide the report information to the division within a

1	time that is consistent with potential level of response needed. Hazardous
2	materials spills and other discharges that require reporting under this section
3	include:
4	(1) Any spill or discharge that causes or may cause pollution of state waters;
5	(2) On a facility or rig site, any spill or discharge of a fluid or substance or
6	derivative of that fluid or substance, including oil, gas, and salt water, which
7	relates to oil and gas exploration or production if that spill or discharge
8	exceeds one barrel;
9	(3) Not on a facility or rig site, any spill or discharge of a fluid or substance or
10	derivative of that fluid or substance, including oil, gas, and salt water, which
11	relates to oil and gas exploration or production; and
12	(4) Any spill or discharge of an agricultural chemical or pesticide that may be
13	detrimental to life or safety or may cause unreasonable adverse
14	environmental effects.
