- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to motorcycle license testing.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision c of subsection 3 of section 39-06-14 of the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

6	C.	A dr	iver with a class M license may operate any motor vehicle having a seat or	
7		saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than three		
8		whe	els in contact with the ground, but excluding motorized bicycles and tractors.	
9		A class M vehicle may not be operated under a class A, B, C, or D license.		
10		(1)	The holder of a class A, B, C, or D license may receive a class M	
11			endorsement upon successful completion of an examination. The director	
12			may waive the skill portion of the examination if the applicant has	
13			successfully completed a motorcycle safety course approved by the director.	
14			The director shall waive the skill portion of the examination for a member of	
15			the United States armed services, the member's spouse, or the member's	
16			dependent, if the member, spouse, or dependent requests a class M	
17			endorsement, is living outside this state because the member is stationed	
18			outside of this state, and has completed a military-approved basic	
19			motorcycle rider training course that is also approved by the motorcycle	
20			safety foundation.	
21		(2)	An applicant sixteen years of age and older, who does not hold a current	
22			valid operator's license may be issued a class-M learner's permit after	
23			successful completion of a written examination. The class M license will be	
24			issued after the applicant has successfully completed a driver's	

1		examination. The director may waive the skill portion of the examination if
2		the applicant has successfully completed a motorcycle safety course
3		approved by the director.
4	(3)	Applicants fourteen or fifteen years of age may be issued a motorcycle
5		learner's permit if the applicant is enrolled in or has completed an approved
6		motorcycle safety course. Applicants for a motorcycle operator's license
7		who are under sixteen years of age shall hold an initial learner's permit for
8		at least two months before applying for a class M operator's license, shall
9		have completed an approved motorcycle safety course, and shall hold a
10		valid motorcycle learner's permit at the time of application. The director may
11		waive the skill portion of the examination if the applicant has successfully
12		completed a motorcycle safety course approved by the director. Any person
13		under sixteen years of age who holds a permit or license is restricted to the
14		operation of a motorcycle powered with an engine of two hundred fifty cubic
15		centimeters, or less, displacement. Evidence that the applicant has
16		satisfactorily completed a motorcycle safety course which meets the
17		minimum requirements of the motorcycle safety foundation must
18		accompany the application.
