- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to North Dakota foster care scholarships.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 6 North Dakota foster care scholarship.
- Any individual who voluntarily remains in this state's foster care system after age
 eighteen is eligible to receive a North Dakota foster care scholarship provided the

- 10 <u>a.</u> <u>Graduated from a high school in North Dakota;</u>
- b. Is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of higher education in this state;
 and
- 13 <u>c. Maintains a cumulative grade point average of 2.75.</u>
- Each North Dakota foster care scholarship is in the amount of seven hundred fifty
 dollars per semester or five hundred dollars per quarter. An individual may not receive
 more than six thousand dollars under this section.
 - 3. An individual receiving a North Dakota foster care scholarship is not required to be enrolled in consecutive semesters or quarters. However, a scholarship awarded under this section is valid for only six academic years after the recipient's graduation from high school and may not be applied to graduate programs.
 - 4. The state board of higher education shall adopt rules to implement the program and monitor each individual receiving a North Dakota foster care scholarship to ensure that the individual meets the stated requirements. Upon determining that an individual no

- longer meets the stated requirements, the board shall provide notification to the
 individual within ten days.
- 5. For purposes of scholarship eligibility under this section, "full time" means enrollment in at least twelve credits during a student's first two semesters and enrollment in at least fifteen credits during each semester thereafter or enrollment in the equivalent number of credits, as determined by the state board of higher education, with respect to students in a quarter system.
 - 6. This section does not preclude an individual from applying for or receiving any other scholarship for which the individual is otherwise eligible.
