- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 54-17.8 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the North Dakota outdoor heritage fund; to amend and reenact subsection 1 of
- 3 section 57-51-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the oil and gas gross production
- 4 tax; to provide an appropriation; and to provide a continuing appropriation.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 54-17.8 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as 7 follows:
- 8 **54-17.8-01. Definitions.**
- 9 <u>1. "Advisory board" means the North Dakota outdoor heritage advisory board.</u>
- 10 <u>2.</u> "Commission" means the industrial commission.
- 11 3. "Fund" means the North Dakota outdoor heritage fund.
- 12 <u>54-17.8-02. North Dakota outdoor heritage fund Continuing appropriation.</u>
- There is created a North Dakota outdoor heritage fund that is governed by the commission.
- Any money deposited in the fund is appropriated on a continuing basis to the commission for
- 15 the purposes of this chapter. Interest earned by the fund must be credited to the fund. The
- 16 commission shall keep accurate records of all financial transactions performed under this
- 17 chapter.
- 18 <u>54-17.8-03. North Dakota outdoor heritage fund purposes.</u>
- 19 <u>1.</u> The commission shall use the fund to provide grants to state agencies, tribal
- 20 governments, political subdivisions, and nonprofit organizations to:
- 21 <u>a. Provide access to private and public lands for sportsmen, including projects that</u>
- 22 <u>create fish and wildlife habitat and provide access for sportsmen;</u>

1		<u>b.</u>	Improve, maintain, and restore water quality, soil conditions, plant diversity,
2			animal systems, and to support other practices of stewardship to enhance
3			farming and ranching;
4		<u>C.</u>	Develop, enhance, conserve, and restore wildlife and fish habitat on private and

6		<u>d.</u>	Conserve natural areas for recreation through the establishment and
7			development of parks and other recreation areas.
8	<u>2.</u>	The	commission may not use the fund, in any manner, to finance:
9		<u>a.</u>	<u>Litigation</u> ;
10		<u>b.</u>	Lobbying activities;
11		<u>C.</u>	Any activity that would interfere, disrupt, or prevent activities associated with
12	1		surface coal mining operations; sand, gravel, or scoria extraction activities; oil
13			and gas operations; or other energy facility or infrastructure development;
14		<u>d.</u>	The acquisition of land or to encumber any land for a term longer than twenty
15			<u>years; or</u>
16		<u>e.</u>	Projects outside this state or projects that are beyond the scope of defined
17			activities that fulfill the purposes of this chapter.
18	54-17.8-04. Commission to staff advisory board.		
19	The commission shall operate, manage, and control the outdoor heritage fund and provide		
20	staffing for the meetings.		
21	54-17.8-05. Powers and duties of commission.		
22	The commission is granted all the powers necessary or appropriate to carry out and		
23	effectuate the purposes of this chapter, including the power to:

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## 1 54-17.8-06. North Dakota outdoor heritage advisory board - Members. 2 There is created a North Dakota outdoor heritage advisory board consisting of twelve <u>1.</u> 3 members. The governor shall appoint representatives from each of the groups listed in 4 this section based upon recommendations made by the appropriate group. The 5 advisory board consists of: 6 Four members from the agriculture community. The governor shall appoint one <u>a.</u> 7 member from the North Dakota farm bureau, North Dakota farmers union, the 8 North Dakota stockmen's association, and the North Dakota grain growers 9 association. 10 Two members from the energy industry. The governor shall appoint one member <u>b.</u> 11 from the North Dakota petroleum council and one member from the lignite energy 12 council. 13 Four members from the conservation community. The governor shall appoint the <u>C.</u> 14 four members from the conservation community from a list of nominees provided 15 to the governor by the North Dakota chapter of the wildlife society one member 16 from ducks unlimited of North Dakota, the North Dakota natural resources trust 17 fund, the North Dakota chapter of pheasants forever, and the conservation 18 community at large. 19 One member from the business community from the greater North Dakota <u>d.</u> 20 chamber. 21 One member with technical background from the North Dakota parks and <u>e.</u> 22 recreation recreation and park association. 23 <u>2.</u> The governor also shall appoint to the advisory board one representative from each of 24 the following agencies to serve as ex officio, nonvoting technical members: the 25 department of parks and recreation, the game and fish department, and the office of 26 the state forester, and the North Dakota association of soil conservation districts. 27 <u>3.</u> The term of office of each member of the board is five four years and members may 28 not serve more than two consecutive terms. The terms of office commence on the first 29 day of July. The initial terms for the advisory board members must be staggered

following a method determined by the board.

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1 The advisory board shall select a chairman from among the members. Seven voting 2 members is a quorum at any meeting. 3 <u>5.</u> The advisory board shall have at least two regular meetings each year and additional 4 meetings as the chairman determines necessary at a time and place to be fixed by the 5 chairman. Special meetings must be called by the chairman on written request of any 6 five members. 7 The advisory board shall recommend to the commission the approval of grants for 6. 8 funding activities that fulfill the purposes of this chapter. 9 Members of the advisory board appointed by the governor serve at the pleasure of the <u>7.</u> 10 governor. 11 54-17.8-07. Report to the budget section of the legislative management. 12 The advisory board shall provide a biennial report to the budget section of the legislative 13 management. 14 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 57-51-15 of the North Dakota Century 15 Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 16 First the tax revenue collected under this chapter equal to one percent of the gross 17 value at the well of the oil and one-fifth of the tax on gas must be deposited with the 18 state treasurer who shall: 19 Allocate five hundred thousand dollars per fiscal year to each city in an a. 20 oil-producing county which has a population of seven thousand five hundred or 21 more and more than two percent of its private covered employment engaged in 22 the mining industry, according to data compiled by job service North Dakota. The 23 allocation under this subdivision must be doubled if the city has more than seven 24 and one-half percent of its private covered employment engaged in the mining 25 industry, according to data compiled by job service North Dakota; 26 Credit revenues to the oil and gas impact grant fund, but not in an amount b. 27 exceeding one hundred million dollars per biennium; and 28 Credit four percent of the amount available under this subsection to the North 29 Dakota outdoor heritage fund, but not in an amount exceeding fifteen million 30 dollars in a state fiscal year and not in an amount exceeding thirty million dollars

per biennium; and

1 <u>d.</u> Allocate the remaining revenues under subsection 3.
