1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for school district rapid enrollment growth grants.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

3	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - SCHOOL DISTRICT RAPID ENROLLMENT GROWTH -	
4	GRANTS. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not	
5	otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$17,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary,	
6	to the The superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of providing ashall provide an	
7	annual grant to any school district that can demonstrate rapid enrollment growth, for the	
8	biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.	
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10	by at least seven percent annually and if that increase is equal to at least twenty	
11	full-time equivalent students, as demonstrated by the district's September tenth fall-	
12	enrollment report, the district is entitled to receive a grant equal to \$3,900 multiplied by	
13	the actual increase in its full-time equivalent student enrollment.	
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15	by at least four percent but less than seven percent annually and if that increase is	
16	equal to at least twenty full-time equivalent students, as demonstrated by the district's	
17	September tenth fall enrollment report, the district is entitled to receive a grant equal to	
18	\$1,950 multiplied by the actual increase in its full-time equivalent student enrollment.	
19	1. A district is eligible to receive a grant under this section if the number of students	
20	reflected in the district's September tenth enrollment report:	
21	a. Exceeds the number of students in average daily membership by at least twenty;	
22	and	
23	b. Represents an increase in students equal to at least four percent.	

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1	2.	In order to calculate the amount to which an eligible district is entitled, the
2		superintendent of public instruction shall:
3		a. Determine the actual percentage increase in the number of students;
4		b. Subtract 2.0 from the percentage established under subdivision a;
5		c. Determine the number of students represented by the difference determined
6		under subdivision b; and
7		d. Multiply the number of students determined under subdivision c by \$3,900.
8	3.	If the amount of the appropriation provided for in this section this purpose in
9		subdivision 1 of section 1 of House Bill No. 1013, as approved by the sixty-third
10		legislative assembly, is insufficient to meet the obligations of this section, the
11		superintendent of public instruction shall prorate the payment based on the
12		percentage of the total amount to which each school district is entitled.
13	4.	The superintendent of public instruction may not expend more than \$8,500,000
14		inone-half of the amount appropriated for these grants under this section during the
15		first year of the biennium.
16	5.	Any district that is precluded from receiving state aid under section 15.1-27-35.3 is not
17		eligible to receive a grant under this section.
