## **SENATE BILL NO. 2262**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 57-40.6-01 and 57-40.6-08, subdivision i of
- 2 subsection 1 of section 57-40.6-10, and section 57-40.6-12 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to fees for 911 services; to repeal sections 57-40.6-02, 57-40.6-03, 57-40.6-03.1,
- 4 57-40.6-04, and 57-40.6-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fees for 911 services;
- 5 and to provide an appropriation.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 57-40.6-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 8 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 **57-40.6-01. Definitions.**
- 10 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 11 1. "Active prepaid wireless service" means a prepaid wireless service that has been used
- by the customer during the month to complete a telephone call for which the
- 13 customer's card or balance was decremented.
- 14 2. "Assessed communications service" means a software service, communication-
- 15 connection, cable or broadband transport facilities, or a combination of these facilities,
- between a billed retail end user and a service provider's network that provides the end-
- 17 user, upon dialing 911, access to a public safety answering point through a permissible
- 18 interconnection to the dedicated 911 network. The term includes telephone exchange
- 19 access service, wireless service, active prepaid wireless service, and voice over-
- 20 <u>internet protocol service.</u>
- 21 3. "Automated notification system" means that portion of a telecommunications system
- 22 that provides rapid notice of emergency situations to the public.

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- "Communication connection" means a telephone access line, wireless access line,
  unique voice over internet protocol service connection, or functional equivalent
  uniquely identifiable by a number, internet address, or other designation.
- 5. "Emergency services communication system" means a statewide, countywide, or citywide radio system, land lines communication network, wireless service network, or enhanced 911 (E911) telephone system, which provides rapid public access for coordinated dispatching of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities for law enforcement, fire, medical, or other emergency services.
  - 6. "FCC order" means federal communications commission order 94-102 [961 Federal Register 40348] and any other FCC order that affects the provision of wireless enhanced 911 service.
- 7. "Prepaid wireless service" means wireless service that is activated in advance by payment for a finite dollar amount of service or for a finite set of minutes that terminates either upon use by a customer and delivery by the wireless provider of an agreed-upon amount of service corresponding to the total dollar amount paid in advance or within a certain period of time following the initial purchase or activation, unless the customer makes additional payments.
  - 8.2. "Public safety answering point" or "PSAP" means a communications facility or combination of facilities operated on a twenty-four-hour basis which first receives 911 calls from persons in a 911 service area and which, as appropriate, may directly dispatch public safety services or extend, transfer, or relay 911 calls to appropriate public safety agencies.
- 9.3. "Public safety answering point service area" means the geographic area for which a
  public safety answering point has dispatch and emergency communications
  responsibility.
- 26 10.4. "Public safety telecommunicator" means an individual whose primary full-time or part-time duties are receiving, processing, and transmitting public safety information received through an emergency services communication system.
- 29 11. "Subscriber service address" means, for purposes of wire line subscribers, the
  30 address where the telephone subscriber's wire line telephone device is used and, for

1		purposes of wireless subscribers, the place of primary use, as that term is defined in				
2		section 57-34.1-02.				
3	<del>12.</del> <u>5.</u>	"Telephone access line" means the principal access to the telephone company's				
4		switched network, including an outward dialed trunk or access register.				
5	<del>13.</del> <u>6.</u>	"Telephone exchange access service" means service to any wire line telephone				
6		access line identified by a unique telephone number that provides local wire line				
7		access to the telecommunications network to a service subscriber and which enables				
8		the subscriber to access the emergency services communications system by dialing				
9		the digits 9-1-1 on the subscriber's telephone device.				
10	<del>14.</del> 7.	"Unpublished" means information that is not published or available from directory				
11		assistance.				
12	<del>15.</del>	"Voice over internet protocol service" means a service that enables real-time two-way				
13		voice communications; requires a broadband connection from the user's location;				
14		requires internet protocol-compatible customer premises equipment; and permits-				
15		users generally to receive calls that originate on the public switched telephone network				
16		and to terminate calls to the public switched telephone network.				
17	<del>16.</del>	"Wireless access line" means each active wireless and prepaid wireless telephone				
18		number assigned to a commercial mobile radio service subscriber, including end users				
19		of resellers.				
20	<del>17.</del>	"Wireless enhanced 911 service" means the service required to be provided by				
21		wireless service providers pursuant to the FCC order.				
22	<del>18.</del> <u>8.</u>	"Wireless service" means commercial mobile radio service as defined in 47 U.S.C.				
23		332(d)(1) and includes:				
24		a. Services commonly referred to as wireless; and				
25		b. Services provided by any wireless real-time two-way voice communication				
26		device, including radio-telephone communications used in:				
27		(1) Cellular telephone service;				
28		(2) Personal communications service; or				
29		(3) The functional or competitive equivalent of a radio-telephone				
30		communications line used in cellular telephone service, personal				
31		communications service, or a network radio access line				

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1	<del>19.</del> 9.	"Wireless service provider" means any entity authorized by the federal				
2		communications commission to provide wireless service within this state.				
3	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 57-40.6-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
4	amended and reenacted as follows:					
5	57-40.6-08. Emergency services communication system, automated notification					
6	system, or emergency instructions - Liability.					
7	1.	A public agency, public safety agency, assessed communications service provider, or				
8		person that provides access to an emergency services communication system or an				
9		automated notification system, or any officer, agent, or employee of any public agency,				
10		public safety agency, assessed communications service provider, or person is not				
11		liable for any civil damages as a result of any act or omission except willful and wanton				
12		misconduct or gross negligence in connection with developing, adopting, operating, or				
13		implementing any emergency services communication plan or system as provided				
14		under this chapter.				
15	2.	A person who gives emergency instructions through a system as provided under this				
16		chapter, to personsa person rendering services in an emergency at another location,				
17		or any person following suchthe instructions in rendering such services, is not liable for				
18		any civil damages as a result of issuing or following the instructions, unless issuing or				
19		following the instructions constitutes willful and wanton misconduct or gross				
20		negligence.				
21	3.	This section does not waive, limit, or modify any existing immunity or other defense of				
22		the state or any political subdivision, or any of its agencies, departments,				
23		commissions, boards, officers, or employees, nor does it create any claim for relief				
24		against any of these entities.				
25	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subdivision i of subsection 1 of section 57-40.6-10 of the North					
26	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:					

Ensure that <u>collected assessed communication</u> fee proceeds <del>collected under this chapter</del> are expended in accordance with guidelines developed <del>pursuant to</del> under section 57-40.6-12 and implement <del>an</del> a <u>sufficient</u> accounting system <del>sufficient to meet the requirements of section 57-40.6-05</del>.

1	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 57-40.6-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
2	amended and reenacted as follows:						
3	57-40.6-12. Emergency services communications coordinating committee -

5	1.	The	governing body of a city or county, which adopted a fee on assessed				
6		con	nmunications services under this chapter, shall make an annual report of the				
7		inco	ome, expenditures, and status of its emergency services communication system.				
8		The	annual report must be submitted to the emergency services communications				
9		coo	rdinating committee. The committee is composed of four members, one appointed				
10		by t	he North Dakota 911 association, one appointed by the North Dakota association				
11		of c	ounties, one appointed by the chief information officer of the state, and one				
12		арр	ointed by the adjutant general to represent the division of state radio.				
13	2.	The	committee shall:				
14		a.	Recommend to the legislative management changes to the operating standards				
15			for emergency services communications, including training or certification				
16			standards for dispatchers;				
17		b.	Develop guidelines regarding the allowable uses of the fee revenue collected				
18			under this chapter;				
19		C.	Request, receive, and compile reports from each governing body on the use of				
20			the proceeds of the fee imposed under this chapterincome, analyze the reports				
21			with respect to the guidelines, file its report with the legislative council by				
22			November first of each even-numbered year regarding the use of the fee-				
23			revenueincome, and recommend to the legislative assembly the appropriate				
24			maximum fee allowed by section 57-40.6-02income adjustments;				
25		d.	Periodically evaluate chapter 57-40.6 and recommend changes to the legislative				
26			management; and				
27		e.	Serve as the governmental body to coordinate plans for implementing emergency				
28			911 services and internet protocol enabled emergency applications for 911.				
29	3.	The	committee may initiate and administer statewide agreements among the				
30		gov	erning bodies of the local governmental units with jurisdiction over an				

emergency 911 telephone system to coordinate the procurement of equipment and

1 services, fund the research, administration, and activities of the committee, and 2 contract for the necessary staff support for committee activities. 3 The committee shall make recommendations to the state treasurer on factors to be 4 used to allocate funds for emergency services communications systems. 5 **SECTION 5. REPEAL.** Sections 57-40.6-02, 57-40.6-03, 57-40.6-03.1, 57-40.6-04, and 6 57-40.6-05 of the North Dakota Century Code are repealed. 7 **SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general 8 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$20,000,000, or so much of 9 the sum as may be necessary, to the state treasurer for the purpose of providing funding for 10 911 services primarily based upon the population of each county and secondarily on other 11 factors from recommendations of the emergency services communications coordinating

committee, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
