- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.5 and 15.1-21-02.6 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility requirements for the North Dakota academic

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.5 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 6 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-21-02.5. North Dakota academic scholarship.
- 8 Any resident student who graduates from a high school during or after the 2010-11 school
- 9 year is eligible to receive a North Dakota academic scholarship provided the student:
- 10 Completed four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature. 11
- composition, and speech;
- 12 2. Completed three units of mathematics, including:
- 13 One unit of algebra II, as defined by the superintendent of public instruction; and a.
- 14 b. One unit of mathematics for which algebra II, as defined by the superintendent of 15 public instruction, is a prerequisite;

Section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows: 7 15.1-21-02.6. North Dakota scholarship - Amount - Applicability. 8 The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as 9 being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North 10 Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical 11 education scholarship in the amount of seven hundred fifty dollars for each 12 semester during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited 13 institution of higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade 14 point average of 2.75. 15 b. (2)The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as 16 being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either a North 17 Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and technical 18 education scholarship in the amount of five hundred dollars for each quarter 19 during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited institution of 20 higher education in this state and maintains a cumulative grade point 21 average of 2.75. 22 The state board of higher education shall provide to any student who b. (1) 23 graduates from high school during or after the 2012-13 school year and who 24 is certified as being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction either 25 a North Dakota academic scholarship or a North Dakota career and 26 technical education scholarship, in the amount of one thousand two hundred 27 fifty dollars, for each semester during which the student is enrolled full time 28 at an accredited institution of higher education in this state and maintains a 29 cumulative grade point average of 2.75. 30 (2)The state board of higher education shall provide to any student who 31 graduates from high school during or after the 2012-13 school year and is
