4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 62.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 62.1-02-05. Possession of a firearm at a public gathering - Penalty - Application.

- 1. A personAn individual who possesses a firearm at a public gathering is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. For the purpose of this section, "public gathering" includes athletic or sporting events, schools or school functions, churches or church functions, political rallies or functions, musical concerts, and individuals in publicly owned parks where hunting is not allowed by proclamation and publicly owned or operated buildings. The term "public gathering" does not apply to a state or federal park.
- 2. This section does not apply to law:
 - a. A law enforcement officers officer; members
- <u>b.</u> <u>A member</u> of the armed forces of the United States or national guard, organized reserves, state defense forces, or state guard organizations, when on duty; competitors
 - c. A competitor participating in an organized sport shooting eventsevent; gun and

- <u>e.</u> <u>A participant</u> using <u>a</u> blank cartridge <u>firearmsfirearm</u> at <u>a</u> sporting or theatrical
 eventsevent; any firearms
- 23 <u>f. A firearm</u> carried in a temporary residence or motor vehicle; students and instructors

In addition, a; <u>h.</u> 3 <u>i.</u> A state or federal park; 4 An individual possessing a valid class 1 concealed weapons license from this Ĺ. 5 state or a valid license issued by another state who has reciprocity under section 6 62.1-04-03.1 authorizing the person individual to carry a dangerous weapon 7 concealed if the individual is in a church building or other place of worship and 8 has the approval to carry in the church building or other place of worship by a 9 primary religious leader of the church or other place of worship or the governing 10 body of the church or is in a school and has the approval to carry by the principal-11 or the governing body of the school or other place of worship. If a church or other 12 place of worship authorizes an individual to carry a concealed weapon, local law 13 enforcement must be informed of the name of the authorized individual; and 14 A municipal court judge licensed to practice law in this state, a district court <u>k.</u> 15 judge, a staff member of the office of attorney general, and a retired North Dakota 16 law enforcement officer are exempt from the prohibition and penalty in-17 subsection 1, if the individual maintains the same level of firearms proficiency as 18 is required by the peace officer standards and training board for law enforcement 19 officers. A local law enforcement agency shall issue a certificate of compliance 20 under this section to an individual who is proficient. 21 3. This section does not prevent any political subdivision from enacting an ordinance 22 which that is less restrictive than this section relating to the possession of firearms at a 23 public gathering. Such anAn enacted ordinance supersedes this section within the 24 jurisdiction of the political subdivision. 25 **SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
