- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-09-13, 16.1-04-02, 16.1-07-09,
- 2 16.1-07-10, 16.1-07-11, 16.1-07-12, and 21-03-11, subsection 4 of section 40-21-02, and
- 3 section 40-21-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to election precincts and voting
- 4 places.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 8 **15.1-09-13. Election precincts - Polling places - Election officials.**

- 9 1. At least thirty-five days prior to the annual election, the board of each school district
  10 shall designate one or more precincts for the election. The board shall arrange the
  11 precincts in a way that divides the electors of the district as equally as possible.
- At least thirty-five days prior to the annual election, the board of each school district
  shall designate one or more polling places for the electioneach precinct. The board
  shall locate the polling places as conveniently as possible for the voters in the
  precinct. Once established by the board, a polling place must remain thea polling
  place for a precinct until it is changed by subsequent action of the board.
- For school board elections not held in conjunction with county elections, the board
   shall appoint two election judges and two election clerks for each precinctpolling place.
   Before opening the polls, the judges and clerks shall take an affirmation or oath to
   perform their duties according to law and to the best of their ability. The affirmation or
   oath may be administered by any officer authorized to administer oaths or by any of
   the judges or clerks.

For school board elections held in conjunction with county elections, the county
 election boards shall administer the election in the same manner as the county or
 state election.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-04-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

16.1-04-02. Voting places - Duties and responsibilities of the board of county

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- 7 commissioners or the governing body of the city.
- 8 The board of county commissioners of each county:
- Shall designate a<u>one or more</u> voting <u>placeplaces</u> for each precinct and may alter the
   voting places when there is a good and sufficient reason. However, the voting places
   for precincts located within the boundaries of any incorporated city must be
   designated, and altered if required, by the governing body of the city.
- Shall provide that all voting places are accessible to the elderly and the physically
   disabled.
- 15 3. May utilize vote centers that contain all of the precincts in a county so that any
- 16 qualified elector of the county may choose to cast a ballot in that polling location.
- 17 Qualified electors may vote early at early voting precincts, by absentee ballot, at thea
- 18 polling location of their residential precinct, or at a county vote center. Vote center
- 19 polling places must serve as the<u>a</u> designated polling place for at least one precinct in
- 20 the county in addition to serving as the site where any county voter may cast a ballot.
- 21 An individual voting or attempting to vote more than once in any single election is 22 guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

23 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-07-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is

24 amended and reenacted as follows:

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16.1-07-09. Canvassing of mailed absent voter's ballots received late.

In the case of congressional, state, county, city, or school district elections, if an envelope postmarked or otherwise officially marked by the United States postal service or other mail delivery system before the date of election and containing an absent voter's ballot is received by the officer too late to be forwarded to <u>a polling place of</u> the proper voting precinct in time to be tabulated, the ballot must be tallied by the canvassing board of the county, the governing body of the city, or the school board of the school district, as the case may be, at the time the returns

1 are canvassed. Any envelope without a postmark or other official marking by the United States 2 postal service or other mail delivery system or with an illegible postmark or other official marking 3 and containing an absentee voter's ballot must be received by mail by the proper officer prior to 4 the meeting of the canvassing board. An absent voter may personally deliver the absent voter's 5 ballot to the appropriate officer's office at any time before five p.m. on the day before the 6 election. Any envelope containing an absent voter's ballot with a postmark or official date stamp 7 on the day of election or thereafter may not be tallied with the ballots timely submitted for the 8 election. Before forwarding any ballot to a canvassing board pursuant to this section, the officer 9 forwarding the ballot shall print the date of receipt on the envelope. Upon receipt, the 10 canvassing board shall determine that the elector was gualified to vote in that precinct, that the 11 elector did not previously vote in that precinct on the date of the election, and that the 12 signatures on the absentee ballot application and the voter's affidavit were signed by the same 13 person before allowing the ballot to be tallied.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-07-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

16 **16.1-07-10. Care and custody of ballot.** 

17 Upon receipt of an envelope containing the absent voter's ballot, the proper officer 18 immediately shall attach the application of the absent voter and file the ballot with other 19 absentee ballots from the same precinct. Before delivering the absentee ballots to a polling 20 place of the proper precinct, the proper officer shall package the ballots in a manner so the 21 ballots are sealed securely. The package must be endorsed with the name of the proper voting 22 precinct, the name and official title of the officer, and the words "This package contains an 23 absent voter's ballot and must be opened only according to the processing provisions of section 24 16.1-07-12." The officer shall keep the package safely in the officer's office until it is delivered by 25 the officer as provided in this chapter.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-07-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

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16.1-07-11. Submitting ballot to inspector of elections.

If the envelope containing the absent voter's ballot is received by the county auditor, auditor or clerk of the city, or business manager of the school district, as the case may be, prior to that <del>person's individual's</del> delivery of the sealed package containing the official ballots to the inspector

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1 of elections of <u>a polling place of</u> the precinct in which such the absent voter resides, such the 2 ballot, after having been enclosed with the application in an envelope as required by section 3 16.1-07-10, must be enclosed in such the package and delivered therewith to the inspector of 4 the precinct polling place. If the official ballots for the precinct have been delivered to the election 5 inspector at the time of receipt by the proper officer of the absent voter's ballot, then the officer 6 or the officer's designee shall personally deliver it to the inspector prior to the close of the polls 7 on election day. Any absent voter's ballot sent to the wrong precinct polling place by the official 8 whose duty it is to forward such the ballots to the precincts, or any absent voter's ballot received 9 by the inspector from the appropriate officer too late to be counted at the precinct polling place, 10 must be returned to the official by the election inspector, and must be tallied by the county 11 canvassing board, the governing body of the city, or the school board, as the case may be, with 12 other absent voters' ballots received too late to be counted on election day.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-07-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

15 16.1-07-12. Opening ballot - Voting or rejecting - Depositing in ballot box - Preserving. 16 At any time beginning on the day before election day and the closing of the polls on election 17 day, the election clerks and board members of the relevant precinct polling place first shall 18 compare the signature on the application for an absent voter's ballot with the signature on the 19 voter's affidavit provided for in section 16.1-07-08 to ensure the signatures correspond. If the 20 applicant is then a duly gualified elector of the precinct and has not voted at the election, they 21 shall open the absent voter's envelope in a manner as not to destroy the affidavit thereon. They 22 shall take out the secrecy envelope with the ballot or ballots contained therein without unfolding 23 the same, or permitting the same to be opened or examined and indicate in the pollbook of the 24 election that the elector has voted. The election board members not participating in the 25 comparing of signatures and entering voters into the pollbook shall remove the ballot or ballots 26 from the secrecy envelope, unfold and initial the same, and deposit in the proper ballot box for 27 tabulation. The votes from these cast ballots may not be tallied and the tabulation reports may 28 not be generated until the polls have closed on election day. If the affidavit on the outer 29 envelope of a returned absentee ballot is found to be insufficient, or that the signatures on the 30 application and affidavit do not correspond, or that the applicant is not then a duly qualified 31 elector of the precinct, the vote may not be allowed, but without opening the absent voter's

envelope, the election inspector or election judge shall mark across the face thereof "rejected
as defective" or "rejected as not an elector", as the case may be. These rejected ballots are
then turned over to the county canvassing board for final determination of eligibility. The
subsequent death of an absentee voter after having voted by absentee ballot does not
constitute grounds for rejecting the ballot.

6 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 21-03-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

# 8 **21-03-11. Elections - When and how called and held.**

9 Upon or after the adoption of an initial resolution by the governing body, or at the first 10 meeting of the governing body held after the filing of a petition and proposed initial resolution by 11 the qualified electors as specified in subsection 2 of section 21-03-10, the governing body by 12 resolution shall provide for submitting to the qualified electors of the municipality the question 13 whether such the initial resolution shall be approved. The date of such the election must be not 14 less than twenty days after the passage of such the initial resolution by the governing body or in 15 the filing of a sufficient petition therefor by the qualified electors. The governing body shall 16 designate the date of such the election, the polling hours, and polling place thereof, which must 17 be the same as for municipal elections therein, and shall appoint an inspector, two judges, and 18 two clerks of election for each polling place. In case of the absence of any such election official 19 of election, or the official's inability to act at the opening of the polls, the remaining election 20 officials for the precinctpolling place shall appoint a qualified elector to fill such the vacancy. 21 Such The election must be conducted and the returns thereof made and canvassed as in the 22 case of elections of members of the governing body of such the municipality. 23 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 40-21-02 of the North Dakota Century

24 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4. For city elections that are not held under an agreement with any county, the governing
body of the city shall appoint one inspector and two judges of election for each
precinctpolling place in the city at least ten days before the election is held and the
polls must be opened and closed as provided for the opening and closing of polls at
statewide elections. In voting precincts in which over three hundred votes are cast in
any previous election, the governing body may appoint two election clerks may be-

31 appointed by the governing bodyfor each polling place. For a city election that is not

- 1 held under an agreement with any county in a precinct in which seventy-five or fewer
- 2 votes were cast in the last city election, the governing body of the city may appoint one
- 3 inspector and one judge <u>for each polling place</u>.
- 4 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 40-21-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 **40-21-16.** Special elections conducted in same manner as general elections.
- 7 Special municipal elections to fill vacancies or for any other purpose shallmust be held and
- 8 conducted by the inspectors and judges of election of the several precinctspolling places in the
- 9 same manner and the returns shall<u>must</u> be made in the same form and manner as at regular
- 10 municipal elections.
