- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-10-37 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to the technology occupations student loan paydown program.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-10-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 15-10-37. Technology occupations student loan <u>paydown</u> program.
 - 1. The state board of higher education shall administer a science, technology, engineering, and mathematics occupations student loan <u>paydown</u> program that encourages college students to pursue studies in these fields, to participate in internship programs, and to remain in the state after graduation. The board shall adopt rules to implement the program, including internship requirements, guidelines to determine which technology-related courses of study are eligible under the program, and standards for eligibility.
 - 2. Graduates of board-approved colleges may apply for the technology occupations student loan program. To be eligible to receive <u>a</u> student loan <u>grantspaydown</u> under the program, the applicantthis section, an individual:
 - a. Must have graduated from a board-approved college;
 - Must have successfully completed the board-approved technology-relatedcourses;
 - Must have maintained at leastan accredited institution of higher education
 located in this state, with a 2.5 grade point average, based on a 4.0 grading system, at a board-approved college;
 - d.b. Must have a<u>an outstanding</u> student loan with the Bank of North Dakota or other participating lender;

- 1 e.c. Following graduation must Must be employed in the this state in a board-approved technology occupation approved by the board; and
 - f.d. Must have met and shall continue to meet any other requirements established by rule.
 - 3. The state board of higher education shall distribute student loan grants directly to the Bank of North Dakota to repay outstandingarrange to pay down the individual's student loan principal balances for eligible applicants by one thousand five hundred dollars per year.
 - 4. The maximum student loan grant amount for which an applicant may qualify is one thousand five hundred dollars per year and a total of amount that an individual is eligible to receive under this section is six thousand dollars, or a lesser amount established byset in rule adopted by the state board of higher education.
