- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for school district safety and deferred maintenance
- 2 grants.

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## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

## 4 SECTION 1. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - SCHOOL DISTRICT SAFETY AND

- There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of awarding to eligible school districts safety and deferred maintenance grants, in accordance with the provisions of this section, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending
- June 30, 2015.
  - 2. If the office of management and budget determines by April 30, 2014, that the June 30, 2014, ending balance of the state general fund will be more than \$30,000,000 in excess of the amount predicted by the office of management and budget at the conclusion of the 2013 legislative session, the superintendent of public instruction shall forward to each eligible school district:
    - a. Twenty Twenty-five thousand dollars; plus
    - b. The school district's pro rata share of the remaining appropriation, calculated by using the latest available average daily membership of each school district.
  - 3. If the general fund balance requirements of subsection 2 are not met and if the office of management and budget determines by April 30, 2015, that the June 30, 2015, ending balance of the state general fund will be more than \$30,000,000 in excess of the amount predicted by the office of management and budget at the conclusion of the
