## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

## 4 SECTION 1. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION - SCHOOL DISTRICT SAFETY AND

5 **DEFERRED MAINTENANCE GRANTS.** 

- 1. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$10,000,000\$4,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of awarding to eligible school districts safety and deferred maintenance grants, in accordance with the provisions of this section, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
- If the office of management and budget determines by April 30, 2014, that the
   June 30, 2014, ending balance of the state general fund will be more than
   \$30,000,000 in excess of the amount predicted by the office of management and
   budget at the conclusion of the 2013 legislative session, the superintendent of public
   instruction shall forward to each eligible school district:
- 17 a. <u>Twenty-fiveTen</u> thousand dollars; plus
- b. The school district's pro rata share of the remaining appropriation, calculated by
  using the latest available average daily membership of each school district.
- 3. If the general fund balance requirements of subsection 2 are not met and if the office
  of management and budget determines by April 30, 2015, that the June 30, 2015,
  ending balance of the state general fund will be more than \$30,000,000 in excess of
  the amount predicted by the office of management and budget at the conclusion of the

7			percent of the funds for safety. Any remaining funds may be dedicated to-
8			deferred maintenance for projects that improve safety.
9		b.	By June 30, 2016, each school district shall <del>:</del>
10			(1) Submitsubmit to the superintendent of public instruction documentation
11			indicating the appropriate expenditure of the funds <del>; or</del>
12			(2) Return the funds to the superintendent of public instruction for deposit in the-
13			state general fund.
14		C.	Authorized expenditures for safety include the purchase, installation, and
15			maintenance of alarms, cameras, electronic door locks, emergency response call
16			buttons, intercom systems, key or pass cards, metal detectors, and other similar
17			equipment designed to minimize the potential for a life-threatening crisis and to
18			maximize the safety of school district students and staff in the event of a life-
19			threatening crisis. Authorized expenditures for safety do not include personnel
20			costs or contracts for the provision of security services.
21	5.	For	purposes of this section, an eligible school district is a school district that:
22		a.	Is not precluded from receiving state aid by section 15.1-27-35.3; and
23		b.	Provides an equal monetary match for any amount received under this section.
24	6.	Mo	neys appropriated under this section are not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and may
25		<u>be</u> 1	forwarded to eligible school districts during the 2015-17 biennium.
