### **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1423**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a mandatory education program for parties to a divorce proceeding
- 3 involving parental rights and responsibilities; and to provide for a legislative management study.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 14-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

#### 7 <u>Divorce proceeding involving parental rights and responsibilities - Education</u>

# 8 program required - Exception.

- 9 <u>1.</u> In an action for divorce which includes the issue of parental rights and responsibilities,
- 10 <u>as defined in section 14-09-00.1, and which does not include substantiated allegations</u>
- 11 of domestic abuse or other showing of good cause, the court shall order the parties to
- the action to participate in an education program regarding the impact of divorce on
   children.
- 14 <u>2.</u> <u>The court shall prepare a list of appropriate education program providers. The</u>
- 15 <u>education program may be an online or a classroom program. The parties are</u>
- 16 responsible for the fees or costs of the education program. The court may assess the
- 17 <u>fees or costs of the education program as the court deems equitable. The court shall</u>
- 18 adopt rules to define the standards for the education program.
- 193. A final decree may not be granted or a final order may not be entered until each party20submits to the court certification of completion of the education program. The court
- 21 <u>may impose sanctions for the failure of a party to the proceedings to comply with the</u>
   22 requirements of this section.

### 23 SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE LAWS.

24 During the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the state's laws

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- 1 regarding marriage and divorce. The study must include a review of options for strengthening
- 2 the institution of marriage and reducing the incidents of divorce in the state, including premarital
- 3 education, marriage counseling, parenting education, and the implementation of predivorce
- 4 requirements, such as divorce-effects education and waiting periods. The study must include a
- 5 review of the minimum standards established by the court for the divorce education programs
- 6 and the efficacy of the programs in the state. The legislative management shall report its
- 7 findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement those
- 8 recommendations, to the sixty-fourth legislative assembly.
