- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to review of presidential executive orders.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 5 and enacted as follows:

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6 Review of presidential executive orders.

7 The state of North Dakota reserves the right to review and, through the legislative

8 assembly, approve or reject any executive order issued by the president of the United States-

9 which has not been affirmed by a vote of the United States Congress and signed into law as-

10 prescribed by the Constitution of the United States. The legislative management may review

- 11 and temporarily suspend the implementation in this state of any such executive order not
- 12 affirmed by the Congress until the legislative assembly, in the next regular or special legislative
- 13 <u>session, has the opportunity to consider each order referred to it by the legislative management.</u>
- 14 The legislative assembly may consider for approval or rejection any executive order issued-
- 15 since two calendar years before the effective date of this Act. The legislative management may
- 16 review any executive order issued by the president of the United States which has not been
- 17 affirmed by a vote of the Congress of the United States and signed into law as prescribed by the
- 18 Constitution of the United States and recommend to the attorney general and the governor that
- 19 the executive order be further reviewed to determine the constitutionality of the order and
- 20 whether the state should seek an exemption from the application of the order or seek to have
- 21 the order declared to be an unconstitutional exercise of legislative authority by the president.
