- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the establishment of a state ethics commission; and to provide a
- 3 penalty.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

7 <u>State ethics commission - Members - Duties - Penalty.</u>

- 8 <u>1.</u> <u>A state ethics commission consisting of nine members may investigate a complaint</u>
- 9 alleging that any member of the legislative assembly, elected or appointed executive
- 10 branch officer, judge of the district court, supreme court justice, candidate for elective
- 11 legislative, executive, or judicial office, lobbyist, or state employee has violated any
- 12 provision of chapter 16.1-08.1 or 54-05.1 or any criminal provision involving corruption
- 13 <u>or misconduct in office.</u>
- 14 <u>2.</u> <u>The ethics commission must consist of:</u>
- 15 <u>a.</u> <u>One member appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.</u>
- 16 <u>b.</u> <u>One member appointed by the house minority leader.</u>
- 17 <u>c.</u> <u>One member appointed by the senate majority leader.</u>
- 18 <u>d.</u> <u>One member appointed by the senate minority leader.</u>
- 19 <u>e.</u> <u>Five members appointed by the governor as follows:</u>
- 20(1)One member selected from a list of five individuals submitted by the21chairman of the North Dakota republican party;
- 22(2)One member selected from a list of five individuals submitted by the23chairman of the North Dakota democratic-NPL party; and

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1		(3) Three members who serve or have served in an elected or appointed
2		position in the judicial branch.
3	<u>3.</u>	The members of the commission shall serve terms of two years with terms
4		commencing on August first of each odd-numbered year. The commission shall select
5		a chairman from among its members and shall meet at the call of the chairman. The
6		commission shall meet within thirty days after the submission of a written complaint
7		alleging an offense as provided under subsection 1.
8	<u>4.</u>	Upon the approval of a majority of the members of the commission, the commission
9		shall investigate any complaint submitted in writing to the commission. A written
10		complaint and any record gathered or created in the course of an investigation initiated
11		by the commission is not subject to section 44-04-18 and section 6 of article XI of the
12		Constitution of North Dakota until the conclusion of the investigation and a report of
13		the investigation has been presented at a meeting of the commission.
14	<u>5.</u>	Upon the approval of a majority of the members of the commission, the commission
15		may refer a complaint to the attorney general or a state's attorney for further
16		investigation and the consideration of criminal prosecution.
17	<u>6.</u>	If the attorney general or a state's attorney to which a complaint is referred determines
18		to not prosecute the subject of the complaint, the attorney general or state's attorney
19		shall provide the commission with a written explanation for the decision not to
20		prosecute.
21	<u>7.</u>	In addition to any applicable criminal penalty that may be imposed as a result of a
22		prosecution under this section, the commission may request the attorney general or
23		state's attorney to seek a civil penalty not exceeding ten thousand dollars to cover the
24		expenses of the investigation against any individual found guilty of a criminal offense
25		initiated under this section.
26	<u>8.</u>	The commission may request an appropriate official to initiate removal proceedings
27		against any individual who is subject to removal from office under law for a violation of
28		an offense prosecuted under this section.
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29	<u>9.</u>	Upon request of the commission, state officers and employees and state's attorneys

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- 1 <u>10.</u> <u>The legislative assembly shall include in the legislative branch appropriation funding</u>
- 2 <u>sufficient to sustain the operations of the commission.</u>
