- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 12.1-32-08, 27-01-10, and 29-26-22 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to costs for insufficient funds checks and assessment of
- 3 court fees; and to repeal section 29-26-22.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to-
- 4 compromise of judgments for court fees and costs by county commissioners.for an Act to
- 5 provide for a legislative management study of the assessment of fees by courts.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12.1-32-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 <u>12.1-32-08. Hearing prior to ordering restitution, reparation, or reimbursement of</u>

10 indigent defense costs and expenses - Conditions - Collection of restitution for-

11 insufficient funds checks - Continuing appropriation.

12 Before imposing restitution or reparation as a sentence or condition of probation, the 13 court shall hold a hearing on the matter with notice to the prosecuting attorney and to-14 the defendant as to the nature and amount of restitution. The court, when sentencing a 15 person adjudged guilty of criminal activities that have resulted in pecuniary damages, 16 in addition to any other sentence the court may impose, shall order that the defendant 17 make restitution to the victim or other recipient as determined by the court, unless the 18 court states on the record, based upon the criteria in this subsection, the reason it 19 does not order restitution or orders only partial restitution. Restitution must include 20 payment to the owner of real property that is contaminated by the defendant in the 21 manufacturing of methamphetamine for the cost of removing the contamination and 22 returning the property to the property's condition before contamination and to any 23 other person that has incurred costs in decontaminating the property. In determining-24 whether to order restitution, the court shall take into account:

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1	a. The reasonable damages sustained by the victim or victims of the criminal
2	offense, which damages are limited to those directly related to the criminal
3	offense and expenses actually incurred as a direct result of the defendant's
4	criminal action. This can include an amount equal to the cost of necessary and
5	related professional services and devices relating to physical, psychiatric, and
6	psychological care. The defendant may be required as part of the sentence-
7	imposed by the court to pay the prescribed treatment costs for a victim of a
8	sexual offense as defined in chapters 12.1-20 and 12.1-27.2.
9	b. The ability of the defendant to restore the fruits of the criminal action or to pay-
10	monetary reparations, or to otherwise take action to restore the victim's property.
11	c. The likelihood that attaching a condition relating to restitution or reparation will-
12	serve a valid rehabilitational purpose in the case of the particular offender
13	considered.
14	The court shall fix the amount of restitution or reparation, which may not exceed an-
15	amount the defendant can or will be able to pay, and shall fix the manner of
16	performance of any condition or conditions of probation established pursuant to this
17	subsection. The court shall order restitution be paid to the division of adult services for
18	any benefits the division has paid or may pay under chapter 54-23.4 unless the court,-
19	on the record, directs otherwise. Any payments made pursuant to the order must be
20	deducted from damages awarded in a civil action arising from the same incident. An
21	order that a defendant make restitution or reparation as a sentence or condition of
22	probation may, unless the court directs otherwise, be filed, transcribed, and enforced
23	by the person entitled to the restitution or reparation or by the division of adult services
24	in the same manner as civil judgments rendered by the courts of this state may be-
25	enforced.
26	2. When <u>Subject to limitations in this subsection, when</u> the restitution ordered by the court
27	under subsection 1 is the result of a finding that the defendant issued a check or draft
28	without sufficient funds or without an account, the court shall impose as costs the
29	greater of the sum of ten dollars or an amount equal to twenty-five percent of the
30	amount of restitution ordered but which may not exceed one thousand dollars. Thelf
31	the costs imposed under this subsection, however, may not exceed one thousand

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1		dollars. The state-employed clerks of district court shall remit the funds collected as-
2		costs under this subsection to the state treasurer for deposit in the restitution collection-
3		assistance fund. The funds deposited into the restitution collection assistance fund are
4		appropriated to the judicial branch on a continuing basis for the purpose of defraying
5		expenses incident to the collection of restitution, including operating expenses and the
6		compensation of additional necessary personnelare imposed in a county in which the
7		state's attorney or county-employed clerk of district court, or both, is responsible for
8		enforcement and distribution of restitution and maintaining victim records, the costs
9		must be added to restitution. The state's attorneysattorney and county-employed
10		clerks of district court <u>clerk</u> shall remit the funds collected as costs under this-
11		subsection to the county treasurer to be deposited in the county general fund. If the
12		costs are imposed in a county in which the state's attorney or county-employed clerk is
13		not responsible for enforcement and distribution of restitution and maintaining victim
14		records, the costs must be added to court fees imposed under section 29-26-22. The
15		clerk of district court shall remit the funds collected as costs in accordance with
16		subsection 2 of section 29-26-22.
17	3.	The court may order the defendant to perform reasonable assigned work as a
18		condition of probation, which assigned work need not be related to the offense-
19		charged, but must not be solely for the benefit of a private individual other than the
20		victim.
21	<u> 4. </u>	a. Under section 12.1-32-07, the court may order that the defendant reimburse-
22		indigent defense costs and expenses as a condition of probation. Unless it finds
23		that there is no likelihood that the defendant is or will be able to pay attorney's
24		fees and expenses, the court, in its judgment of conviction, and in any order or
25		amended judgment following a revocation or other postjudgment proceeding,
26		shall notify the defendant, the defendant's probation officer, and the prosecuting
27		attorney of the presumed amount of costs and expenses to be reimbursed, as
28		determined by the commission on legal counsel for indigents, and of the right to a
29		hearing on the reimbursement amount. The reimbursement amount must include
30		an application fee imposed under section 29-07-01.1 if the fee has not been paid
31		before disposition of the case and the court has not waived payment of the fee. If

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1	the defendant or prosecutor requests a hearing within thirty days of receiving-
2	notice under this subdivision, the court shall schedule a hearing at which the
3	actual amount of attorney's fees and expenses must be shown. In determining
4	the amount and method of reimbursement, the court shall consider the financial-
5	resources of the defendant and the nature of the burden that reimbursement of
6	costs and expenses will impose.
7	b. A defendant who is required to reimburse indigent defense costs and expenses
8	as a condition of probation and who is not willfully in default in that
9	reimbursement may at any time petition the court that imposed the condition to
10	waive reimbursement of all or any portion of the costs and expenses. If the court
11	is satisfied that reimbursement of the amount due will impose undue hardship on-
12	the defendant or the defendant's immediate family, the court may waive-
13	reimbursement of all or any portion of the amount due or modify the method of
14	payment.
15	c. If at any time the court finds that the defendant is able to reimburse costs and
16	expenses and has willfully failed to do so, the court may continue, modify, or
17	enlarge the conditions of probation or revoke probation as provided in-
18	subsection 6 or 7, as applicable, of section 12.1-32-07.
19	5. If the court finds that the defendant is unable to pay a fine, supervision fee,
20	reimbursement for indigent defense costs and expenses, or restitution or reparations,
21	the court may order the defendant to perform reasonable assigned work in lieu of all or-
22	part of a fine, a supervision fee, reimbursement for indigent defense costs and
23	expenses, or restitution or reparations. The defendant may not perform reasonable-
24	assigned work in lieu of restitution or reparations unless the person entitled to
25	restitution or reparations has consented in writing or on the record.

The district or municipal judge-14 may assess the fee when sentence is imposed or when sentence is suspended or 15 imposition of sentence is deferred, unless the defendant is indigent and unable to pay-16 the fee. 17 All fees paid to a district or municipal court under this section and subdivision d of-18 subsection 2 of section 29-26-22 must be deposited monthly in the county or city-19 treasury for allocation by the governing body of the county or city to one or more of the 20 following programs as determined by the governing body: 21 - A private, nonprofit domestic violence or sexual assault program. a. 22 b. A victim and witness advocacy program of which the primary function is to-23 provide direct services to victims of and witnesses to crime. 24 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 29-26-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is-25 amended and reenacted as follows: 26 29-26-22. Judgment for fines - Court administration fee - Community service 27 supervision feeDisposition of fees - Special funds - Docketing and enforcement. 28 - In all criminal cases except infractions, upon a plea or finding of guilt, the court shall-29 impose athe following court administration fee in lieu of the assessment of court costs. 30 The court administration fee must include: a fee of onetwo hundred twenty-fivefifty-31 dollars for a class B misdemeanor, twofour hundred dollars for a class A misdemeanor,

1foursix hundred dollars for a class C felony, sixeight hundred fifty dollars for a class B2felony, and nine hundredone thousand dollars for a class A or AA felony.3-2. In addition, in all criminal cases except infractions, the court administration fee must4include one hundred dollars. Of the additional one hundred dollar court administration5fee, the first seven hundred fifty thousand dollars collected per biennium must be6deposited in the indigent defense administration fund, which must be used for indigent7defense services in this state, and the next four hundred sixty thousand dollars8collected per biennium must be deposited in the court facilities improvement and-9maintenance fund. After the minimum thresholds have been collected, one-half of the10additional court administration fee must be deposited in each fund. A fee imposed-11under subsection 1 must be distributed in the following manner:12a. Sixty-eight and two-tenths percent must be deposited in the state general fund.13b. Fourteen and five-tenths percent must be deposited in the indigent defense.

15 <u><u>c.</u> <u>Twelve and two-tenths percent must be deposited in the court facilities</u></u>
16 <u>improvement and maintenance fund.</u>
17 <u>d. Four and seven-tenths percent must be deposited monthly in the county treasury</u>
18 <u>if the county in which the fee is assessed has authorized acceptance of the fee</u>
19 by resolution under section 27-01-10. If the county has not adopted a resolution
20 <u>accepting the fee, the fee amount must be deposited in the state general fund.</u>
21 <u>e.</u> Four-tenths of one percent must be deposited in the community service
22 <u>supervision fund, which must be used to provide community service grants</u>
23 <u>subject to legislative appropriation.</u>
24 <u>3. In addition to any court administration fees that may be imposed under subsections 1</u>
25 and 2, the court shall impose upon each defendant who receives a sentence that
26 includes community service a community service supervision fee of twenty-five dollars.
27 The community service supervision fee must be deposited in the community service
28 supervision fund. The fees deposited in this fund must be used to provide community-
29 service supervision grants subject to legislative appropriations.
30 <u>4. A court may waive the administration fee or community service supervision</u>
31 fee <u>required under subsection 1</u> upon a showing of indigency as provided in section-

1	25-03.1-13. District court administration fees, exclusive of amounts deposited in the
2	indigent defense administration fund and the court facilities and improvement fund,
3	and forfeitures must be deposited in the state general fund. A judgment that the
4	defendant pay a fine or fees, or both, may be docketed and if docketed constitutes a
5	lien upon the real estate of the defendant in like manner as a judgment for money-
6	rendered in a civil action. The court may allow the defendant to pay any assessed
7	administration fee or community service supervision fee in installments. When a
8	defendant is assessed administration fees or a community service supervision-
9	feeunder subsection 1, the court may not impose at the same time an alternative
10	sentence to be served if the fees are not paid.
11	SECTION 4. REPEAL. Section 29-26-22.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
12	SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - ASSESSMENT OF FEES BY
13	COURTS. During the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the
14	assessment of fees by courts, the feasibility and desirability of combining various court fees,
15	and whether courts should be mandated to impose fees established by statute. The legislative
16	management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation
17	required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fourth legislative assembly.
