FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Conference Committee Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1008

(At the request of the Governor)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service
- 2 commission; to amend and reenact sections 49-01-05 and 64-02-10 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to the salary of public service commissioners and fees to test or
- 4 calibrate weighing and measuring devices; to provide for legislative management studies; to
- 5 authorize a transfer; to provide a statement of legislative intent; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of
that agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

15 2015-17 biennium. The public service commission shall report to the appropriations committees

16 of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium

17 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

20 **49-01-05.** Salary of commissioners.

The annual salary of a commissioner is <u>ninety-twoninety-nine</u> thousand <u>eightfour</u> hundred twenty-sixthirty-five dollars through June 30, 20122014, and <u>ninety-fiveone hundred two</u> thousand <u>sixfour</u> hundred <u>eleveneighteen</u> dollars thereafter. All fees received or charged by any commissioner for any act or service rendered in any official capacity must be accounted for and paid over by the commissioner monthly to the state treasurer and must be credited to the general fund of the state.
SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - CIVIL PENALTIES. The legislative

management shall consider studying, during the 2013-14 interim, civil penalties assessed and
collected by state agencies, including a review of the funds into which the collections are
deposited and the appropriateness of the use of funds collected. The legislative management

22	When a test of a weighing or measuring device is required in addition to the regularly		
23	scheduled test, the commission shall charge a fee equal to the cost of operating the motor		
24	vehicle used in conducting the test. The mileage charges, as determined by the commission,		
25	must be in addition to the regular test fee and calculated to cover the costs of the additional		
26	travel. If a test has been requested and the person requesting it fails to appear or to have the		
27	weighing or measuring device ready for testing at the arranged time, there is a charge of ten		
28	dollars a quarter hour for the time between the arranged time and the time at which the test can		
29	begin.

30 SECTION 7. TRANSFER AND REPAYMENT - BEGINNING FARMER REVOLVING LOAN FUND. The sum of \$900,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the 31

- 1 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act, shall be transferred by the Bank of North
- 2 Dakota from the beginning farmer revolving loan fund to the public service commission to pay
- 3 for costs associated with a rail rate complaint case. Transfers shall be made during the
- 4 biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, upon order of the commission. If
- 5 any amounts are spent pursuant to this section, the public service commission shall reimburse
- 6 the beginning farmer revolving loan fund using amounts available from damages or proceeds
- 7 received, net of legal fees, from a successful outcome of a rail complaint case.

8 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - GAS PIPELINE SAFETY INSPECTOR AND

- 9 **PUBLIC UTILITY ANALYST.** It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the public service
- 10 commission proceed in the hiring process of the gas pipeline safety inspector and public utility
- analyst positions that have been repurposed in the commission's 2013-15 biennium budget
- 12 from the weights and measures program prior to June 30, 2013.
- 13 **SECTION 9. EMERGENCY.** Section 8 of this Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
