1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the agriculture

2 commissioner; to create and enact a new section to chapter 19-13.1 of the North Dakota

3 Century Code, relating to license, inspection, and registration fees; to amend and reenact

4 section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the agriculture

5 commissioner; to provide for transfers; to provide for a legislative management study of the milk

6 marketing board: to provide for a report to the sixty-fourth legislative assembly; and to provide

7 an exemption.

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8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
10 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
11 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
12 other income, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that
13 agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

SECTION 2. TRANSFER - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND MINOR USE PESTICIDE FUND. The agriculture commissioner shall transfer \$325,000 from the
 environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund during the biennium
 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

20 SECTION 3. ESTIMATED INCOME - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION

FUND. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of

22 \$5,997,408\$6,064,403, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the environment and

23 rangeland protection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of various department of

agriculture programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June-30, 2015.

SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAME AND FISH FUND. The estimated income line
 item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$484,398, or so much of the sum as may be

- 27 necessary, from the game and fish department operating fund for the purpose of defraying the
- 28 expenses of various agriculture department of agriculture programs, for the biennium beginning
- 29 July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

30 SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - STATE WATER COMMISSION - TRANSFER. The
 31 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$250,000 which the state

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1 water commission shall transfer to the agriculture commissioner for the wildlife services 2 program, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 3 SECTION 6. EXEMPTION - JOHNE'S DISEASE CONTROL. The amount appropriated for 4 Johne's disease control in section 1 of chapter 35 of the 2011 Session Laws is not subject to 5 section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended appropriations may be continued into the biennium 6 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 7 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended 8 and reenacted as follows: 9 4-01-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner. 10 The annual salary of the agriculture commissioner is ninety-twoninety-eight thousand 11 eightfour hundred twenty-sixseventy-eight dollars through June 30, 20122014, and 12 ninety-fiveone hundred one thousand sixfour hundred tenthirty-two dollars thereafter. 13 SECTION 7. NORTH DAKOTA MEDIATION SERVICE - REPORT TO SIXTY-FOURTH 14 **LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The agriculture commissioner shall provide a report to the 15 appropriations committees of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly regarding the activities of the 16 North Dakota mediation service. The report must include information regarding the amount of 17 funding used for the program, the use of contracted services for the program, the success of 18 resolving disputes, and the amount of services provided for agriculture mediation, energy 19 development mediation, and other mediation areas. 20 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended 21 and reenacted as follows: 22 4-01-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner. 23 The annual salary of the agriculture commissioner is ninety-two thousand eight hundred-24 twenty-sixninety-nine thousand four hundred thirty-five dollars through June 30, 20122014, and 25 ninety-five thousand six hundred tenone hundred two thousand four hundred eighteen dollars 26 thereafter. 27 SECTION 9. A new section to chapter 19-13.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 28 and enacted as follows: 29 **Deposit of fees.** 30 The commissioner shall forward all inspection fees, license fees, and registration fees received under this chapter to the state treasurer. The state treasurer shall deposit the first 31

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- 1 <u>\$485,000</u>\$727,500 of fees received under this chapter each biennium in the environment and
- 2 rangeland protection fund and any remaining fees in the general fund.

3 SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - MILK MARKETING BOARD.

4 During the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the structure of

- 5 the milk marketing board; its statutory duties; the manner in which it prescribes and regulates
- 6 producer, distributor, and retail prices throughout the state; and the manner in which it
- 7 investigates and resolves concerns regarding the price and availability of milk throughout the
- 8 state. If conducted, the study must review any policy or regulatory changes that the board has
- 9 implemented in order to address pricing issues and availability of milk in the western portion of
- 10 this state. The study must examine whether the continued regulation of the grade A dairy
- 11 industry is best accomplished by the milk marketing board in its current form and operating
- 12 under its current statutory directives, whether changes are needed to the board or its statutory
- 13 directives, and whether there are other methods by which the desired results could be
- 14 effectively and efficiently achieved. The legislative management shall report its findings and
- 15 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 16 the sixty-fourth legislative assembly.
