1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of

2 public instruction, the state library, the school for the deaf, and North Dakota vision services -

3 school for the blind; to provide for a transfer to the general fund; to provide for the distribution of

4 funding for gifted and talented programs and other grants; to amend and reenact sections

5 15.1-02-02 and 15.1-18.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the

6 superintendent of public instruction and the national board certification program; to provide

7 exemptions; to provide legislative intent; to provide an effective date; and to declare an

8 emergency.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of public instruction, the school for the deaf, North Dakota vision services - school for the blind, and the state library for the purpose of defraying the expenses of those agencies, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

28 2015-17 biennium. The department of public instruction, state library, school for the deaf, and

29 North Dakota vision services - school for the blind shall report to the appropriations committees

30 of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium

beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

1 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from special funds derived from 2 federal funds the sum of \$25,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the 3 superintendent of public instruction for grants for the period beginning with the effective date of 4 this Act and ending June 30, 2013. 5 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$140,326,000, 6 included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is 7 from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund 8 that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of 9 public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 10 2015. 11 SECTION 5. TRANSFER - PROPERTY TAX RELIEF SUSTAINABILITY FUND TO THE 12 **GENERAL FUND.** The office of management and budget shall transfer the sum of 13 \$341,790,000 from the property tax relief sustainability fund to the general fund, for the 14 biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 15 SECTION 6. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITION 16 **TRANSFER - BUDGET SECTION APPROVAL - LINE ITEM TRANSFER - EMERGENCY** 17 COMMISSION APPROVAL. The superintendent of public instruction shall transfer six full-time 18 equivalent information technology positions to the information technology department by 19 September 30, 2014. If the superintendent of public instruction and the chief information officer 20 of the information technology department choose not to transfer these positions by 21 September 30, 2014, the superintendent of public instruction may request budget section 22 approval for an extension of the transfer deadline. After the positions are transferred, the 23 department of public instruction may seek emergency commission approval to transfer funding 24 from the salaries and wages line item to the operating expenses line item to pay for information 25 technology services provided by the information technology department. 26 SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION - INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT. There is 27 appropriated from special funds derived from other income, the sum of \$880,953, or so much of 28 the sum as may be necessary, to the information technology department for the purpose of 29 defraying the expenses of six full-time equivalent information technology positions transferred 30 from the department of public instruction, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending

1 June 30, 2015. The information technology department is authorized six full-time equivalent

2 positions.

3 SECTION 8. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

4 CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY. The superintendent of public instruction may
5 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education
6 contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational
7 services that were due in the 2011-13 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly
8 supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2013.

9 SECTION 9. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM - MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING 10 DISTRIBUTION.

The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in
 subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts
 or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an
 application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the
 superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall
 encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts
 and special education units.

State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of
 matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for
 students participating in the medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the

- 21 amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special
- education unit must be paid by the superintendent of public instruction to the
- 23 department of human services on behalf of the school district or unit.

24 SECTION 10. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS. During the 2013-15

biennium, the superintendent of public instruction shall expend up to \$800,000 from the

26 integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for the purpose of

- 27 providing an annual grant to each eligible regional education association in order to assist each
- 28 association with the cost of compensating a coordinator.
- In order to receive a grant under this section, each regional education association
 must:

1		a.	Ent	er a contract with an individual to serve as a coordinator, on a full-time or a
2			part	t-time basis, for a duration of at least twelve months; and
3		b.	Pro	vide from other revenue sources at least thirty percent of the total

INDIRECT COST ALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-15, the 4 department of public instruction may deposit indirect cost recoveries in its operating account. 5 SECTION 14. EXEMPTION - FUNDING POOL FOR INITIATIVES - LINE ITEM 6 **TRANSFER.** Notwithstanding the provisions of section 54-16-04, the superintendent of public 7 instruction shall transfer funding from the funding pool for initiatives line item in subdivision 1 of 8 section 1 of this Act, to the extent necessary, to the appropriate line item for expending the 9 funds for each initiative. The superintendent of public instruction shall report to the office of 10 management and budget regarding all transfers from the funding pool for initiatives line item. 11 SECTION 15. OTHER GRANTS - REPORTING. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION STUDY - FEDERAL FUNDING. 16 The superintendent of public instruction shall study the costs and benefits of accepting federal 17 funds and the consequences of declining federal funds and report its findings to the sixty-fourth 18 legislative assembly. 19 SECTION 17. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - GEARING UP FOR KINDERGARTEN. It is the 20 intent of the sixty-third legislative assembly that school districts may participate in the gearing 21 up for kindergarten program if approved by the school board of the local school district. 22 SECTION 18. STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES. The line item entitled grants in 23 subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$1,500,000 for aid to public libraries, of which no 24 more than one-half is to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014. 25 SECTION 19. FEES DEPOSITED IN NORTH DAKOTA VISION SERVICES - SCHOOL 26 FOR THE BLIND OPERATING FUND. Any moneys included in the estimated income line item 27 in subdivision 4 of section 1 of this Act, collected for subscription fees or braille fees, must be 28 deposited in the North Dakota vision services - school for the blind operating fund in the state 29 treasury and may be spent subject to appropriation by the legislative assembly. 30 SECTION 20. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF - HIGHER EDUCATION INTERPRETER GRANT

1	PROGRAM. The grants line item contained in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act is for the					
2	purpose of providing grants to assist institutions under the control of the state board of higher					
3	educatio	on with the cost of interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf or				
4	hard of	hearing, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. Moneys				
5	appropr	iated for this program are not subject to section 54-44.1-11. Funds shall be distributed				
6	pursuan	t to the provisions of this section:				
7	1.	The school for the deaf shall develop a formula to determine the grant amount for				
8		which an institution is eligible. The formula must be based on a uniform hourly				
9		reimbursement.				
10	2.	To obtain a grant under this section, an institution shall submit to the school for the				
11		deaf, at the time and in the manner directed by the school, invoices showing the				
12		amount expended for interpreters and real-time captioning for students who are deaf				
13		or hard of hearing.				
14	3.	The school for the deaf may not distribute more than fifty percent of the amount				
15		appropriated during the first year of the biennium.				
16	4.	If any grant moneys remain undistributed at the end of the biennium, the school for the
