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- 1 The 2013-15 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 2 2015-17 biennium. The department of public instruction, state library, school for the deaf, and 3 North Dakota vision services - school for the blind shall report to the appropriations committees 4 of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium 5 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 6 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from special funds derived from 7 federal funds the sum of \$25,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the 8 superintendent of public instruction for grants for the period beginning with the effective date of 9 this Act and ending June 30, 2013. SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - TUITION APPORTIONMENT. The sum of \$140,326,000, 10 11 included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is 12 from the state tuition fund in the state treasury. Any additional amount in the state tuition fund 13 that becomes available for distribution to public schools is appropriated to the department of 14 public instruction for that purpose for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30. 15 2015. 16 SECTION 5. TRANSFER - PROPERTY TAX RELIEF SUSTAINABILITY FUND TO THE 17 GENERAL FUND. The office of management and budget shall transfer the sum of 18 \$341,790,000 from the property tax relief sustainability fund to the general fund, for the 19 biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. 20 SECTION 6. INTEGRATED FORMULA PAYMENTS AND SPECIAL EDUCATION 21 **CONTRACTS EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY.** The superintendent of public instruction may 22 expend funds included in the integrated formula payments and grants - special education 23 contracts line items in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act in payment of grants for educational 24 services that were due in the 2011-13 biennium but which were not filed, claimed, or properly 25 supported by the education provider until after June 30, 2013.
 - SECTION 7. GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM MEDICAID MATCHING FUNDING DISTRIBUTION.
 - 1. The sum of \$800,000, included in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, must be distributed to reimburse school districts or special education units for gifted and talented programs upon the submission of an application that is approved in accordance with guidelines adopted by the

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- superintendent of public instruction. The superintendent of public instruction shall encourage cooperative efforts for gifted and talented programs among school districts and special education units.
 - 2. State school aid payments for special education must be reduced by the amount of matching funds required to be paid by school districts or special education units for students participating in the medicaid program. Special education funds equal to the amount of the matching funds required to be paid by the school district or special education unit must be paid by the superintendent of public instruction to the department of human services on behalf of the school district or unit.

SECTION 8. REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS - GRANTS. During the 2013-15 biennium, the superintendent of public instruction shall expend up to \$800,000 from the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act for the purpose of providing an annual grant to each eligible regional education association in order to assist each association with the cost of compensating a coordinator.

- In order to receive a grant under this section, each regional education association must:
 - a. Enter a contract with an individual to serve as a coordinator, on a full-time or a part-time basis, for a duration of at least twelve months; and
 - Provide from other revenue sources at least thirty percent of the total compensation payable to the coordinator.
- 2. The maximum grant payable to a regional education association under this section during each year of the biennium is the lesser of \$50,000 or seventy percent of the total compensation payable to the coordinator.

SECTION 9. TRANSPORTATION GRANTS - DISTRIBUTION.

- During each year of the 2013-15 biennium, the superintendent of public instruction shall calculate the payment to which each school district is entitled based on the state transportation formula as it existed on June 30, 2001, except that the superintendent shall provide reimbursement at the rate of:
 - a. One dollar and thirteen cents per mile for schoolbuses having a capacity of ten or more passengers;

1 Fifty-two cents per mile for vehicles having a capacity of nine or fewer 2 passengers; 3 C. Fifty cents per mile, provided: 4 The student being transported is a student with a disability, as defined in 5 chapter 15.1-32; 6 (2) The student's individualized education program plan requires that the 7 student attend a public or a nonpublic school located outside the student's 8 school district of residence: 9 (3) The student is transported by an adult member of the student's family; 10 (4) The student is transported in a vehicle furnished by the student's parents; 11 The student's transportation is paid for by the student's parents; and (5) 12 (6) The reimbursement does not exceed two round trips daily between the 13 student's home and school; 14 Fifty cents per mile, one way, provided: d. 15 The student being transported resides more than two miles from the public 16 school that the student attends; 17 (2) The student is transported by an adult member of the student's family; 18 (3) The student is transported in a vehicle furnished by the student's parents; 19 and 20 (4) The student's transportation is paid for by the student's parents; and 21 Thirty cents per student for each one-way trip. 22 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall use the latest available student 23 enrollment count in each school district in applying the provisions of subsection 1. 24 3. If any moneys provided for transportation payments in the grants - transportation line 25 item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, remain after application of the formula 26 provided for in this section, the superintendent of public instruction shall prorate the 27 remaining amounts according to the percentage of the total transportation formula 28 amount to which each school district is entitled. 29 This section does not authorize the reimbursement of any costs incurred in providing 30 transportation for student attendance at extracurricular activities or events.

 - SECTION 15. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY STAFFING ANALYSIS.
