- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the parks and
- 2 recreation department and for providing a grant to the International Peace Garden; to provide

3 for matching funds; and to provide an exemption; and to declare an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
other income, to the parks and recreation department for the purpose of defraying the expenses
of the parks and recreation department and for providing a grant to the International Peace
Garden, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

21	committees of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the				
22	biennium beginning July-1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.				
23	SECTION 3. GAME AND FISH OPERATING FUND - TRANSFER - BOAT RAMP				
24	OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE. The sum of \$122,000, or so much of the sum as may be				
25	necessary, included in the natural resources line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is				
26	from the game and fish operating fund, or federal or other funds available to the game and fish				
27	department, and must be transferred to the parks and recreation department for maintenance,				
28	operating, and extraordinary repairs expenses relating to boat ramps at state parks for the				
20	bioppium boginning luby 1, 2012, and anding lung 20, 2015				

biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

30 SECTION 4. MATCHING REQUIREMENT - INTERPRETIVE EXHIBITS. The natural
 31 resources line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$200,000 for

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1 completion of interpretive exhibits at the Icelandic state park visitor center. This amount consists 2 of \$150,000 from the parks and recreation fund, derived from park fees and other income, and 3 \$50,000 from the state parks gift fund. The \$50,000 appropriated from the state parks gift fund 4 must be provided to the department as matching funds from nonstate sources for the 5 completion of the interpretive exhibits. 6 **SECTION 5. EXEMPTION.** Up to \$400,000\$600,000 of community grants funding from the 7 general fund included in the recreation line item contained in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this 8 Act is not subject to the provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this 9 appropriation may be expended during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending

SECTION 6. OIL-RELATED REVENUE - NEW WELLS. Fifteen percent of any revenue
received by the department from oil wells completed after July 1, 2013, must be used for the
community grants program for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
Any remaining revenue received from these oil wells may only be used for one-time funding
items.

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SECTION 7. PROPERTY PURCHASE IN WALHALLA GORGE AND FROST FIRE AREA.

17 The natural resources line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$2,800,000 for 18 the purchase of property in the Walhalla gorge and frost fire area. Of this amount, up to-19 \$1,670,000 from the general fund and \$830,000 of other funds from local matching funds may 20 be used for the purchase of land and buildings. For each \$2 of funding from the general fund-21 used for the purchase, \$1 of other funds from local matching funds must be received in cash by-22 the department before the purchase is made. The land and buildings may not be purchased for 23 more than the appraised value. The remaining amount of \$300,000 from the general fund may-24 be used for operations, a business plan, and other related expenses.

SECTION 7. CONTINGENT FUNDING - INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN CAPITAL
 PROJECTS. The sum of \$2,500,000 from the general fund included in subdivision 2 of
 section 1 of this Act is for capital projects at the International Peace Garden and is contingent
 upon the International Peace Garden raising matching funds on a dollar-for-dollar basis from
 nonstate sources.

30 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY. The natural resources line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of
 31 this Act includes \$3,730,000, of which \$2,930,000 is from the general fund and \$600,000 is from

- 1 special funds derived from federal funds and other income, for various capital projects, which is
- 2 declared to be an emergency measure.
